Halley administered the oath of office to Lane and de-clared him the marshal, and thereafter said William Lane fraudulently and in furtherance of the conspiracy, claimed to be the marshal of Pendleton, and unless constrained by an order of the court, will continue to claim to be marshal and to harrass and annoy plaintiff Heathman in his duties.


