COLUMBIA GEORGE'S HAIR.

The Imprisoned Indian Sends it to His Wife as a Keepsake.

Several days ago a package came to Colonel William Parsons, addressed in his care, with Mrs. Columbia George, or Mrs. U-In-Ma as the address read, as the consignee. It was nothing but a mat of long, black hair, coarse, and not worth anything for sale to a hair dresser. Colonel Parsons wondered who in the world had sent such a peculiar gift to a lady, but concluded upon reflection that it was his client's, Columbia George's, own capillary substance, and that the imprisoned Indian had at last been compelled to suffer the loss of his locks that are the pride of any resident of the reservation. This proves to be the case, and the package of hair will go to its new owner in due time.

When George was sentenced to go to Salem penitentiary, for the killing of Annie Edna, the Indian sorcerer, he begged that he be allowed to retain his hair. It is disgrace for any Indian to have his locks shorn. It was this that caused the suing of the Indian policeman, Brisbo, a few years ago, when the Indian court of offenses was declared illegal by Judge Fee, and the court broke up. As George entertained the same loathing of having his long hair cut.

But George is a life prisoner, and had to conform to the rules of the penitentiary, so his hair came off. Then he conceived the idea of sending it as a memento to his wife who has stood by him so faithfully through his incarceration and trial. The package of hair she will treasure as long as she lives, and regard it with such sentiment as would not appeal to a white woman similarly situated.

Walla Walla Criminal Cases.

Walla Walla, Jan. 16.—The docket for the jury session of the superior court has just been made up, and the jury will report for duty next Monday morning. The docket is a light one for January, and one week will likely be sufficient time for the trial of all cases now ready. The cases against a number of saloon keepers for opening their places on Sunday, will not be tried, an agreement of continuance having been reached. A case is now pending in the superior court and the continuance is along the line of settlement after the decision has been handed down.

At a special meeting of the Baker City Chamber of Commerce a formal petition to congress from the residents of Oregon, Washington and Idaho asking for the removal of the obstructions in the upper Columbia and the deepening of the channel at the mouth of the river, was presented and all of the business men present signed it.
