THE MAN WHO LOST GIFTS TO HIS BRIDE

Stovordale Married to Lady Helen Stewart in London—A Brilliant Affair.

London, Jan. 25.—Young Lord Stavordale and Lady Helen Stewart, the beautiful daughter of Lord Londonderry, were married at St. Peter's church, Eton square, at 1 o'clock this afternoon. The ceremony, which was fully choral, was conducted by the Primate of England. The bride wore a dress of white satin, trimmed with the Brussels lace worn by her mother and grandmother, Theresa Lady Shrewbery. Two pages, dressed like "Gainsborough's famous blue boy" and two little girls followed the bride. Then came ten bridesmaids, attired in dresses of soft white silk, trimmed with d'Alencon lace and beaver fur and white hats, trimmed with white and yellow jonquils. The bridesmaids were Lady Muriel Fox-Strangways, sister of the bride; Edith Lawson, Lady Viola Talbot, Lady Dartrey, Miss Muriel Chaplin, Miss Hicks-Beach, Miss Madelane Stanley, Miss Margaret Beaumont, Miss Marion Beckett and Miss Gladys Reckett.

The semi-public marriage of Lord Stavordale attracted great popular interest, and there were fully 6,000 persons watching the arrival at the church which was filled to overflowing. Besides the members of the two families there were present many persons of high social prominence.

The bride, accompanied by her father, was received at the church door by the choir, which sang a nuptial hymn. The procession advanced to the chancel, where it was joined by the bridesgroom and the best man, Lord Hyde. There was a scene of great brilliance as the procession solemnly approached the altar through the building, which was beautifully decorated with various white flowers and ferns.

After the ceremony at the church there was a reception at Londonderry House, and later the bridal couple left for Ingestre Hall on the honeymoon.

The wedding presents were of great magnificence, diamonds predominating. Included among the gifts was a magnificent sapphire and diamond crescent from the prince and princess of Wales, the superb Antrim diamonds from the bride's father, a large diamond brooch, and three fine sets of lace and sable muff and bonnet, and a pearl necklace from Lord Ilchester and a diamond, emerald and pearl necklace from Lord Ilchester.

The bride of today is the fifth child of Lord Londonderry and a reigning favorite in society. She is seven years the senior of her husband. Lord Stavordale is a lieutenant in the Royal guards Reserve and lieutenant in the Royal Scots. He is the

Wedding of Archduchess.

London, Jan. 25.—A Vienna dispatch says: The marriage of the Archduchess Elizabeth, granddaughter of Emperor Francis Joseph, to Prince Otho of Vindisch-Gratz crowns another of the many romances to which the Austrian Royal family is addicted. Only with great reluctance did the aged emperor give his consent to the betrothal, not being able to deny it is said, the wish of his favorite granddaughter, with whom it is a love match pure and simple. Her husband, though be-

longing to a noble Austrian house, is only a younger son of a junior branch and a lieutenant in the Uhlan regiment.

According to the announcement, the bridal pair will spend the first week of their honeymoon at Schloss Seebach, near Velden, in Carniola, which belongs to the prince's father. The young couple will then proceed to Florence, Rome, Naples and Palermo, where they intend remaining a month. About ten days will be spent in Taormina, and various excursions made to Catania, Syracuse, Malta and Tunis. The return to Vienna will be made about the middle of April. At the end of that month they will most likely proceed to Prague, where Prince Otho is to be garrisoned for the space of two years.
