CHARMING PLAY-STORY

"RUPERT OF HENTZAU."

Anthony Hope's Sequel to "Prisoner of Zenda," Has Small Patronage in Pendleton.
 Like "Margery Daw" in Thomas Bailey Aldrich's charming story, "Ruritans," the realm of King Rudolph V. in "Rupert of Hentzau," has no existence excepting in the mind of the author. As a work of imagination, however, it is a strong tale, especially adapted to the requirements of the stage. With a good Rudolph, both as king and pretender, and a good Queen Flavia, a part taken by Miss Charlotte Tittell, a superb Sapt, an ideal Rupert, and other excellent members cast for the parts, the production of the play at the Frazer on Tuesday night was worthy a larger house than was present on that occasion. Even with a mediocre company essaying the piece, the story itself has charms both literary and dramatic, yet the people of Pendleton sent out only a small number of people to witness the presentation. A minstrel show of average merit would have had a crowded house in comparison.

SCHLEY IN BATTLE

STORY OF THE BATTLE AND THE REAR-ADMIRAL.

George Edward Graham, Eye Witness, Publishes a Book That Does Justice to the Nation's Hero.

The East Oregonian receives, with request that it be reviewed, a copy of "Schley and Santiago," by George Edward Graham, a detailed account of the cruise of the flying squadron, the blockade and final destruction of the Spanish fleet. Mr. Graham is the manager of the Associated Press at Albany, N. Y., and was their special representative on board the Brooklyn during the entire five months of the campaign. The book is illustrated with instantaneous photographs taken on by the author during the cruise and during the fight, and contains also a personal narrative of the battle by Rear-Admiral Winfield Schley. The book was written with the direct sanction of Admiral Schley. It also has the absolute and unqualified endorsement of the Admiral as an authentic statement of facts concerning the battle of Santiago.

Persons who delight in honoring the "Hero of Santiago" will read this book with special pleasure, inasmuch as it details the facts in a manner to support the position taken by Admiral Dewey, who said in his minority report that Schley was undoubtedly in command at Santiago, and entitled to credit for winning the battle. From the standpoint of the admirers of Schley, the following credentials for the book will serve as complete endorsement, and cause it to be sought by them. Rear Admiral Schley writes thus of the volume: "Mr. Graham served with me on the Brooklyn from the beginning to the end of the campaign against Cervera's fleet. He was in a position in the open to know the facts and all operations against it have been given as he saw them. The personal views and criticisms of the author I do not endorse, though the facts of the story of the movements and operations of the Flying Squadron as he tells them in this book are correct so far as I can remember."
