WESTON NORMAL HAS
A NEW BUILDING.

Structure Is Complete—To Be Inspected on Saturday by Regents.

Weston, Jan. 31.—The new normal school building at this place is now completed. The board of regents will be here to investigate its construction Saturday. If built according to the stipulated contract, Contractors Earl Van Patton & Co., of Salem, will turn it over to the state.

This building, on which work commenced last June, is erected at a cost of \$35,000, which was appropriated by the last session of the legislature. The new building is three stories high besides the basement; is of stone and brick; its dimensions are 58x82 and the whole building contains 19 rooms. The basement will be used for gymnasium and a laboratory purposes; the first and third floors are divided into class-rooms and the second floor is the chapel, which has a seating capacity of 600. Take it all in all, it is a fine building and a credit to Weston as well as the Eastern end of the state. It is said that this is the finest building owned by the state that has been erected without a heavier outlay of money than this one cost. This reflects much credit on the board of regents as well as the contractors who engineered the work.

It is not expected to place the new building into use until about the first of March, and then the old one will not be discarded, but will be kept up for training purposes.

The normal here is in a very flourishing condition and has students from all parts of the East end of the state. The enrollment has almost reached the hundred mark, and it will be a great relief to the faculty as well as students when they can get out of the old building and their cramped quarters into the new one.
