## COMMERCE - TRADE

**PRICE OF WHEAT HAS FALLEN  
1 1/2c SINCE LAST SATURDAY.**  
Estimated That There Is Barely 200,000 Bushels of Wheat Left in Farmers' Hands in the County.  
Pendleton, Feb. 27.—There has been another decided slump in the world's wheat market which has affected the local market considerably and today it is quoted at 52 1/2 cents, against 54 cents, which was the local figure last Saturday. This was the highest mark reached since the marketing of the 1901 crop began, and the farmers who held on to their crops had begun to feel that they had been amply paid for being without the use of the money the wheat would have brought them several months ago, when it was quoted below 50 cents. However, the raise did not cause all to let go, as some came to the conclusion that 60 cents would be offered before there was another drop, but on this score they were mistaken and many of them are now wishing they had let go at last Saturday's prices.  
While there are a great many farmers who were effected by the depression in the foreign markets which caused the slump locally, the greatest majority have sold and have the money. Local dealers estimate that out of the total crop of last year there is not more than 200,000 bushels yet in the hands of the farmers, and most of this is in small lots scattered all over the county in the different warehouses, there only being two or three large holdings left.
