GENERAL NEWS

Although the republican caucus voted some time ago in favor of Cuban reciprocity at 20 per cent, no action has been taken by the ways and means committee further than the introduction of a bill to that effect by its chairman.

What is popularly known as the oleomargarine bill places a tax of 10 cents a pound on oleomargarine colored in imitation of butter, and reduces the present tax of 2 cents per pound on oleomargarine to one-quarter of 1 cent a pound in its uncolored form.

A conference was held at the White House between the president and several republican members of the house of representatives who have been foremost in opposing the plan of Cuban reciprocity urged by the ways and means committee, and understood to have the support of the administration.

PACIFIC NORTHWEST NEWS

At Albany the sentiment among delegates elected to the republican county convention to meet Wednesday seems to be in favor of a neutral position on the governorship, and of an unpledged delegation, free to act according to developments in the state convention.

Representative Moody introduced a bill giving to district and circuit courts of the United States original jurisdiction of all civil suits arising between members of Indian tribes on government reservations, and between such Indians and other persons not members of such tribes.

Spokane pattern-makers in iron works have decided to demand a nine-hour day after May 5, wages to remain at \$3.50, the same as now paid for 10 hours.

Mrs. Christina Gillmore, who had resided in Oregon 48 years, died at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. George Hoeye, in Oregon City, on Monday, aged 77 years.

The bodies of two young men were found on the Mountain division of the Tillamook & North Yamhill stage route by the mail carrier Saturday morning, frozen to death.
