Tourist Rates Debated. New York, March 26.-The settlement of the summer tourist rates is the important business before the joint passenger committee in session here today. The rivalry between the roads east and west has reached a point where a disastrous rate appears possible and it is to discuss the situation with a view of diverting this trouble that the passenger agents are now in session. Some time since it was proposed to put summer tourist rates of about half fare to all the eastern seaside resorts in order to compete with the lower rates which will be in force to western resorts. Western passenger men became alarmed at the attitude of the easterners and are threatening to refuse to accept the rates for basing purposes if offered them. The propositions of the easterners provide for rates from Chicago, Cincinnati, Louisville, St. Louis, Indianapolis and other large centers in the middle west to all eastern summer resorts at figures corresponding to the rates in effect upon all western lines to Colorado and Utah common points and to Pacific resorts.
