REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CITY INTERESTS

Commends Various Things for Better-

ment of Conditions in the Town. Tuesday night was the regular monthly meeting time of the Pendleton Commercial Association. Little business came up for discussion ex-cept the report of the committee on city interests, and the appointment of a committee of three to confer with the Woodmen of the World and to work with them in getting the city decorated for the coming log-rolling. George K. Rogers was present and talked to the association on the subject, urging that they take up the matter in helping to make the logrolling a success.

Suggestions by City Committee.

The committee on city interest, after an introductory statement disclaiming criticism of the city officials, made these suggestions, the report being signed by C. J. Smith, W. H. Jones

and J. F. Robinson: First-Relative to the matter of street sprinkling. The street committee of the city council informs us that the matter has been taken up and will properly be cared for by that body and that the business interests of the city will not necessarily have to look after this matter as they have

on other occasions. Second-While it is plain with all that certain of our streets-especially that of East Court street, east of Byers mill race, to the city limits, and portion of west Alta street-are in bad condition, we are informed that addition. Fine location and well gradthis will also be attended to by the city as soon as possible.

Third-That we believe it to be the best interests of the city from both sightly and sanitary standpoints, to have certain ordinances enacted requiring property owners, or occupants through the nostrils, cleanses and of the property, to care for their portion of the street immediately in front of their residences or place of busi- catarrh which is drying or exciting to ness, keeping the sidewalks clean by sweeping and the street and gutters clear of paper and other obnoxious

Fourth-Remembering that the accommodation of the people coming from the country to trade in this city is a matter of great importance, we would suggest, as a matter of convenience and accommodation to them, that more hitching room be provided and that it be provided in such a place as not to injure the residence portion

Fifth-That this committee would recommend that this body interest itself at once in assisting the water commission in putting water in the

Sixth-We would further recom mend that this body take interest at once in securing some place of resort or promenade for the citizens.

The above recommendations met the hearty approval of the association and steps will be taken at once to see that they are to le carried out in as far as possible.
