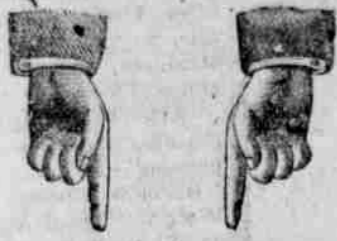

# AMBER FACTORY

JACOB BETZ WILL BUILD A NEW \$90,000 BREWERY.

Walla Walla Beer Maker Proposes to Make it of Iron, Steel and Brick.

Walla Walla, April 5.—A \$90,000 brewery erected upon modern lines, fully equipped to do a great business, is being planned for by Jacob Betz, the well known brewer of this city, who for several years was mayor and a prominent politician. The building is to be erected on South Third street on a block of land owned by Mr. Betz and is to be five stories high, covering most of the block. The material used in construction will be brick, stone and steel. The estimated cost is \$90,000, and the work is expected to begin in a few weeks.

Mr. Betz is organizing a company with a capital stock of \$200,000 to enter the business, and will go East shortly to interest wealthy friends in the enterprise. Mr. Betz now has a large brewery here, but it has proven entirely too small for the business he is able to command.

In speaking of it a few days ago, Mr. Betz said:

"I want the property for Jacob Betz, Jr. We intend to erect not only the largest, but the best equipped building in Walla Walla. Everything will be modern and be constructed to last. Steel will take the place of wood and a clock will occupy the tower at the top. The town needs one. Just as soon as I can secure the necessary materials the work of building will begin. Stone and brick I can get but there is a scarcity of steel, the rolling mills being overtaxed at the present time, and that will occasion the delay. The plans are not yet completed. My equipment will come from New York, Brooklyn and Cincinnati, and it is there that I will dispose of the stock that I have for sale. The present brewery will be utilized until the new machinery is in active operation and then the old place will gradually be abandoned and merged into the new."

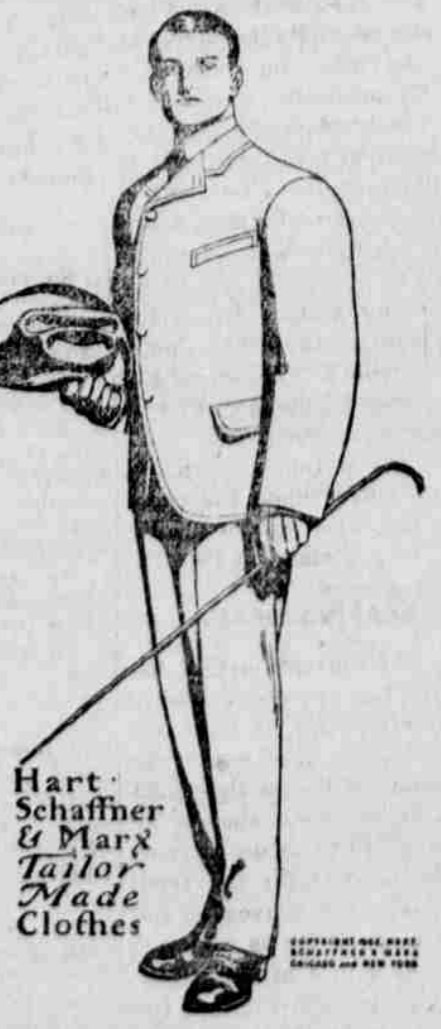
