## DEMOCRATS WORK

MECCA OF HUNDREDS.  
Great Gathering of Prominent and Representative Texans.

El Paso, Tex., April 16.—The Pass City is today the Mecca for hundreds of the most prominent and representative citizens of Texas. From every point of the state and from various points in New Mexico, Arizona and Mexico as well, the representatives of the Knights Templar have gathered for the forty-ninth annual convocation of the grand commandery. For several months the committee of reception and entertainment, composed of the most prominent and active templars of the jurisdiction, has been preparing for the advent of the hosts that will sojourn in this city for a week or more to come, and even thus early the hundreds of visitors are willing to admit that this work has been well done. The decorations form a most pleasing feature of the gathering. On every hand, over doors and windows, spanning the streets, or floating from tall flagstaves, are the cross, shield and sword, the cross, square and compass, the mottoes of the order, and a plentiful profusion of the stars and stripes. Among the delegations already here are those from Houston, Austin, Galveston, Fort Worth, Dallas and San Antonio. A notable feature of the gathering this year is the great number of visitors who are attracted simply as spectators. There appears to be no end to the bands of music here and with the parade and other festivities, the side trips to Mexico, Cloudercroft and other places of interest there is sure to be nothing lacking in the way of entertainment for the visitors.

**Urge Democrats to Register.**  
They urge that all democrats register prior to May 15, when the registration books close and they ask for registration lists from each county as well as weekly reports on the matter in order that it may be known at headquarters what interest is being taken in the campaign.

**Organize Democratic Clubs.**  
Another topic on which great stress is laid is the organization of ward clubs. Democratic clubs are wanted wherever they can be formed in the state, and when these are formed a corps of spellbinders will be sent through the country on the stump. In several towns strong clubs have already been organized, and the intention is to have a club in every hamlet with which to stir up enthusiasm for Chamberlain for governor and the other nominees of the democratic ticket.
