CORPORATIONS MUST FAY ONE PER CENT OF GROSS EARNINGS

LAWS

The New Law Will Add \$2,000,000 a Year to the State's Income; Tom Johnson Forced Measure on State. All quasi-public corporations must pay into the state treasury in the future a tax of 1 per cent on their gross incomes, and all private cor-porations, formed for the purpose of profit must pay one-tenth of one per cent ou their capital stock.

These two laws, which in their earlier stages have been known as the Willis and Cole bills, were passed by the senate a few days ago. The Tom Johnson movement in the state influenced the republicans to take the step in taxation in order that sohnson's efforts might be forestalled.

The house having already passed them, and as the governor of Ohio has no veto power they will go into effect at once.

Together the two new laws will add \$2,000,000 a year to the state treasury, but they have an even greater importance than this, for they are the main steps in Governor Nash's taxation plan, which when fully carried Alexander Dept. Store out will work an entire reorganization in the tax system of the state.

Only the First Step.

They are the main steps toward oringing about a condition in which direct property taxes are as a means of securing revenue for the state go ternment will be entirely abandoned. while every cent of the necessary money will be secured from corporaone form or another.

The property taxes both on real estate and on personality, are to be quality, prove attractions irresisti- left to the counties and municipalities exclusively. In this way the state board of equalization will no longer have any reason for existence as it will make no difference to one part of the state how high or how low where good style and real worth the assessment is in another part. and the abolition of the board will normally follow.

In carrying out the scheme still further a bill will be passed by both house and senate levying a tax of 21/2 per cent of their premiums on all foreign insurance companies doing business in the state, whereby \$800,000 a year will probably be raised.

There are Two Classes.

All the corporations in both classes are required to file with the secretary of state the information upon which the tax levy against them is to be made. Private corporations chartered in Ohio and existing for the sake of profit must file the facts about their capital stock, subscribed and paid up, and its par value, in May. The secretary of state is then at once to charge and collect the tax of onetenth of one per cent.

Foreign corporations for profit file their statements in September, and are taxed only on that proportion of

The penalty for disobeying the law is a fine of \$500 and \$100 a day additional. If corporations complain of their tax the secretary of state must first hear them, and from him they can appeal to the auditor of the state. the treasurer of state and the attorney general, whose decision shall be final.

The public service corporations affected by the Cole bill are electric light, gas, natural gas, pipe line, water works, street railways, express, telephone, telegraph, messenger or signal and union depot companies.

First Time for Some.

The suburban or interurban railways, express, telegraph, telephone and union depot companies are included for the arst time, while the others are raised to 1 per cent of their gross earnings from the 7/2 of 1 per cent they paid before.

Railroads must file their information in September, but all other companies in May.

To compensate the corporations for the extra burdens, several amendments were introduced and adopted. One is a resolution providing for the submission of a constitutional amendment striking out the provision that all property be taxed according to uniform rules. Another limits the double liability of stockholders in Ohio corporations to eighteen months after their stock has been transferred.
