### GENERAL NEWS

There is a recrudescence of the plague in Cape Colony. Ten cases have been reported, five of which have proved fatal.

The Denver Times has been sold by its bondholders for \$110,000. David H. Moffatt, president of the First National bank being the purchaser.

The Vincennes hotel, thirty-sixth street and Vincennes avenue, Chicago, was destroyed by fire Monday. All the occupants escaped in safety. Loss \$150,000.

As General Mercier, ex-Minister of War, was leaving a political meeting in Paris at which he had presided, he was stoned and sustained a wound in the head.

The passage in congress of the river and harbor bill without an irrigation amendment of any kind, means that there will be no irrigation legislation at this session of congress.

The need for rain in Kansas has become so dire that Bishop Fink, whose diocese consists of the eastern third of Kansas, has ordered prayers said daily by every Catholic under his jurisdiction.

David Carpenter, who was a personal friend of Horace Greeley and John C. Fremont, is dead at his home in Mount Pleasant, New York. At the close of the civil war he was among the first to introduce American iron into the market.

The Cotton Belt line has been enjoined from moving its offices from Tyler, Texas, to Texarkana, where the ground has been purchased and work begun on a five-story office building. The road years ago, made a contract with the citizens of Tyler, which cannot be broken without the consent of both parties.

### PACIFIC NORTHWEST NEWS

There are two cases of smallpox at Oregon City.

Nine sprinkling wagons are used for sprinkling purposes on the streets in Walla Walla.

William Abel of Auburn, Baker county, died a few days ago, aged 79 years. He came to Oregon in the 50's.

Francis Ross, a young girl, died at Shaniko, Wasco county, of diphtheria and there is a scare there in consequence.

Clark Whitchee, aged 68 years, died at his home, at Buxton, Lane county, where he had resided for 20 years. Deceased was born in New York and was a bachelor.

About a year ago Arthur Kirtley, a La Grande young man, went to Nicaragua. His parents at La Grande are in receipt of the news of his death.

State Food and Dairy Commissioner J. W. Bailey made a big seizure of short-weight butter at the La Grande creamery in Portland, Monday. The butter was made by the Eugene creamery. All of the butter, about 500 pounds, was confiscated by the state.

Mrs. M. Simington, wife of James Simington, of Rieckreall, Polk county, died at the home of her son, Willis Simington, in Dallas. She was born in Pennsylvania, 59 years ago last December, and came to Oregon with her husband and family 14 years ago, and had lived in Polk county ever since.

Dawson telegrams say melting snows have formed streams sufficient to permit clean-up operations. The washing out of gold commenced last week, and will keep up for two months. During the winter the greatest dumps in the camp's history have been thrown up on the banks of the creeks, insuring an aggregate clean-up estimated at \$30,000,000.

### LEAGUE BASEBALL SEASON

#### TRANSFER OF MILWAUKEE'S FRANCHISE TO ST. LOUIS.

The Season Will be the Most Profitable in the History of the Sport, In All Parts of the Country.

Chicago, Ill., April 22.—American League ball for the season of 1902 begins today. The conditions and circumstances surrounding the opening of the season are all that could be desired and President Johnson and his lieutenants are jubilant over the outlook. By the transfer of Milwaukee's franchise to St. Louis the circuit has been strengthened, so it is believed, and unless the forecasts of all close followers of the national game go astray the season will be the most successful and the most profitable in the history of the sport. The Chicago club, the champions of last year, lined up against the Detroit club at the South Side grounds this afternoon in the presence of a crowd that packed the grandstands and bleachers, despite the fact that the latter have been extended to twice the capacity of last year. The other game scheduled for the day are Cleveland in St. Louis, Boston in Washington and Philadelphia in Baltimore.
