He immediately secured her a permit to join the regiment as a regular army nurse, and she proudly marched to the front with teers



Besides being an army nurse of wide reputation Mrs. Young is the founder ce of two state sanitary associations, one in New York and the other in Iowa. The first had its beginning in Ithaca, N. Y., when she was a girl at the outbreak of the civil war. The latter was organized in Des Moines at the beginning of the Spanish-American war.
