Philadelphia, Pa., May 3.-The stockholders the Choctaw, Oklahoma & Gulf railroad, the control of which is shortly to go into the hands of the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railway company are to decide to For sale by Tallman & Co., sole day on a proposition to buy the agents. Choctaw Northern railroad and then resell it to the Rock Island. The deal, it is estimated, would mear a profit of over \$600,000 to the stockholders of the Choctaw. The line which it is proposed t obuy is already controlled by the Choctaw. It is 137 miles long and is an important feeder to the Choctaw road.
