SUMPTER ANTICIPATES BEST SEASON IN HER HISTORY.

Work In the Big Mines of the District Has Passed the Development Stage and Monthly Output is Stimulating to Business."

Jas. A. Howard, secretary of the Red Boy Consolidated Gold Mines \$5.75; Chas. King. \$1.50; Jesse Lieu-Co., and the Golconda Consolidated allen, \$1.50; Fred Gerberding. Gold Mines Co., has returned from his trip of inspection to the mines. In speaking of things in the Sumpter country and these mining properties, Mr. Howard said:

founds everything running smoothly at the Red Boy and the camp in general, from a mining standpoint, seemed very prosperous. although the towns were somewhat dull. Sumpter, however, is looking forward to the coming summer as being the best season in her history, and I believe, if the plans now being laid out for the development of the town and country are carried out the expectations are fully justified.

"I visited the Golconda mine last week and found things there very lively. Mr. Melkel, superintendent of the mines, feels greatly elated over the fact that he has been able to disclose high grade ore at several points in the new works.

"It is generally understood that the old Golconda company never had any pay ore to amount to anything below the 200-foot level. Its work seems, for the most part, to have been directed south from the shaft. while the policy of Mr. Meikel has been to drive north on the vein.

"On the 300 foot level, at a point about 100 feet north from the shaft. the rich ore shoot, originally worked by the old company, was encountered and we are now driving in as good a grade of ore as one could wish to see, it being 12 feet wide and all of milling grade. On the 300 foot level immediately under the point from which the rich ore was extracted by the old company and which made the Sumpter gold fields famous, we have been able to pick up this rich shoot.

"We are now sacking for shipment a streak of ore from 1 to 2 feet wide that runs from high grade shipping ore to hundreds of dollars per ton.

"The management at the mine feel perfectly confident that with only a few weeks work they have demonstrated beyond question of north at a very heavy angle and Columbia joining it on the north.

### DEATH PENALTIES OF THE STATE TO BE PAID THERE.

Capital Punishment to Be Adminia tered in the Penitentiary at Walla Walla for All the Counties of the State.

Walla Walla, May 8 .-- With perhaps one or two exceptions, every man who will hereafter suffer the death penalty in this state will be brought to this city and within the walls of the state penitentiary the fatal drop will occur. On the west side a case or two still hang fire in the courts, but on the east side no murderer is confined awaiting his doom at the hands of a county sheriff. A wise or unwise legislature made the provision, and now there are several second-hand hanging machines in the different counties which could be sold at bargain sale and Virgili money.

The next murder committed in this state, if punished by death, will be avenged in this city, and the superintendent of the state penitentiary ARTISTIC DECORATOR will have charge of the work. It has been often questioned here as to the result of the new order of things on the men confined in the prison here. About 580 men are now at the penitentiary, several serving life sentences, but none under sentence of is about to occur.
