THE MAZE HOLDUP

THE ELLIS-STANLEY SHOOTING AT ELLENSBURG.

The Murderer of Stanley Suspected of Being the Leader of the Gang Who Held Up the "Maze" Saloon, September Last.

The shooting affray at Ellensburg last Sunday evening between Jack Ellis and Ben Stanley, which resulted in the death of the latter and the landing of the former in jail, has caused considerable comment in Pendleton, where both men are quite well known. Ellis is probably the best known of the two, as he has been around Pendleton off and on for the past six or eight years and was a member of the Second Oregon regiment, which won fame in the Philippines.

This shooting scrape has also revived in the memory of Pendleton people, renewed interest in the "Maze" saloon hold-up in Pendleton, some six months ago, when five men entered this resort, just after dark, and stood the inmates up in a row, while the money from the roulette, faro and card tables was pocketed by the robbers, and, since Ellis has got into the trouble, it is generally whispered that he had something to do with this robbery. He was suspected from the start, but no evidence could be obtained, and now it is openly stated that he planned the affair and led the gang that did the hold-up job. One thing that strengthened the belief that Ellis was implicated, was the fact that he was a heavy gambler and a frequent player on his betting table at the gaming tables. He tried to force the man to let him raise the limit and let him bet all he wanted to, but this was denied and Ellis told a friend that he would force the games to give him a big limit and that he would "make 'em go for a big chunk."

This was only a few days previous to the hold-up and robbery, and Ellis left town for Walla Walla the morning after the hold-up, and has not been here but once since, when he only remained for a few days and then did not make himself very conspicuous.

From the way the "Maze" hold-up was planned and carried out, it was evident that the perpetrators were familiar with the lay of the land. No clew could be discovered at the time that would warrant an arrest, but now that there is reason to believe that the leader of the gang is in jail with a charge of murder against him, it is not improbable that the other four will also be in the law's clutches soon.
