REPUBLICAN RALLY

HON. J. N. WILLIAMSON SPEAKS TONIGHT.

Judge J. C. Moreland Will Also Speak at the Frazer Opera House—A Torchlight Procession Tonight Through the Streets.

Local republicans will have a big rally and blow-out in honor of the visit of Hon. J. N. Williamson, candidate for congress, and Hon. J. C. Moreland, of Portland, who will address the people at the Frazer opera house this evening.

Messrs. Williamson and Moreland arrived this morning on the 8:10 train and were met at the train by the reception committee, composed of Thomas Thompson, J. S. Gurdane and E. P. Marshall. The guests were escorted to Hotel Pendleton, where they have been entertained today.

At 7 o'clock this evening the program will begin at the republican headquarters, in the La Dow block, and form in a torchlight procession. The procession will be headed by the Helix brass band and a fife and drum corps. The procession will be composed of all the local republicans who can be formed in line and the young men's republican club, composed of from 100 to 150 young men from the ages of 16 to 21. From the place of forming in line, they will march to the Hotel Pendleton and be joined by the distinguished guests and then the procession will make a tour up Main street to Alta, up Alta to College and then back to Court and down to the opera house where the speaking will begin at 8 o'clock. Fireworks, such as Roman candles and firecrackers will be used to add to the effect of the procession. J. E. Krause will be marshal of the ceremonies.
