ELECTION ARRESTS.

But Few People Were Caught Trying Illegal Voting.

Yesterday was a very quiet day for election day and contrary to the expectations of many, few arrests were made in the county for alleged voting without a right.

G. R. and H. B. Smith, brothers, claiming to have hailed from Portland, were the only men arrested in town and they were placed in jail, where they still remain, charged with voting illegally. They went to East Pendleton precinct and attempted to vote but were challenged and not allowed to vote there. Then they went to Pendleton precinct and there the judges allowed them to cast their vote after finding that they had been declared legal voters by six freeholders of the county. The men were immediately arrested and thrown in as the result but what disposition will be made with them is not known, as their records will be looked into before action is taken.

Several others attempted to vote in Pendleton who were challenged and not allowed to cast their ballot, and several were challenged who showed that they did have a right to a vote and were allowed access to the polls.

COURT POSTPONED.

Owing to Election and Other Causes, Session Adjourned Until Monday.

Today should have opened the June term of the district court for Umatilla county, but owing to the election and other matters which kept District Attorney Hailey away for the past week, and the rush of work on the part of some others connected with the opening of the court, it did not open this morning and Judge W. R. Ellis issued an order postponing the convening until Monday.

Perhaps not in the history of Umatilla county has there been as few cases to come before the court as at this term and those to be tried are all minor civil cases with not a single criminal case to come up.

The docket has not yet been made out and it is impossible to know just what the cases are.

THE BOY KING OF SPAIN.

Many Kings and Queens Have Gone Into Office in Their Youth.

People are speaking of the boy king of Spain as if it were something unusual for a child to come to the throne. When history is examined it will be found that many kings and queens came to high office while in their childhood and that several who are recalled as the greatest monarchs of their time began to rule when they were even younger than Alphonse XIII.

In 1823 Isabella, Alphonso's grandmother, was a queen at 3; Marie was queen of Portugal at 7, and Pedro became emperor of Brazil at the age of 8. At the same time Greece was ruled by a boy, Prince Otho of Bavaria, not out of his teens, and when he was expelled after a short and unsuccessful reign he was to be succeeded by another young man of 18, Prince George of Denmark, brother of Queen Alexandra of England. The present emperor of Austria was only 18, when he was proclaimed. The late Queen Victoria was only 18 when she came to the throne.

All these monarchs lived in the 19th century. Similar conditions will be found to have existed at one time or another in the past centuries in nearly all the countries of Europe. The names of 10 young monarchs will be found in English history. Henry III. came to the throne when he was 10, Edward III. when he was 15, and Richard II. when he was 11. Henry VI. and Edward IV., whose reigns witnessed the wars of the roses, began to rule as mere boys, the former aged 20 and the latter scarcely 8. Henry VIII. was 18 when he began his somewhat remarkable reign and his throne descended to his son when he was but a lad of 10.

On the continent some of the kings who left the deepest impress on history were proclaimed when mere boys. The brilliant Charles XII of Sweden was only 15, Louis IX of France 11, the great Louis

XVI, who ended his life on the scaffold in the French revolution, began his eventful reign when only 16, and he had more serious problems before him than any now confronting the young Spanish monarch.—Spokane-Review.

Jackson, Miss., June 3.—Today, the anniversary of Jefferson Davis' birth, collections were made in every city and town in Mississippi in aid of the fund for the home for Confederate veterans. More than one-half of the required sum—\$10,000—has already been raised and it is believed that today's collections will yield more than enough to carry the project into effect.

Sent Up for Six Months. San Francisco, June 3.—C. S. Mains, recently convicted of using the mails for fraudulent purposes in promoting an alleged billion dollar syndicate, was sentenced today to six months in the Alameda county jail.

The 200 garment workers of Syracuse, N. Y., mostly Hebrews, struck today for a nine-hour day, with the same pay now given for 10 hours.
