Rock Island Increases Capital. Chicago, June 4.-To provide means for important extensions to the Gulf of Mexico, and possibly toward the Pacific Coast, the stockholders of the Rock Island road at their annual meeting today voted to increase the capital stock from \$60,000,000 to \$75,-000,000. This is the largest increase in capital since the consolidation in 1890. The stock was then \$41,960, 000; in 1896 it was increased to \$46, 500,000. In 1890 it was raised to the authorized limit of \$50,000,000. Last June it was increased to \$60,000,000. The funded indebtedness in meantime has been increased from -.7,500,000 to \$68,000,000.
