MONEY NOW RAISED TO PAY EXPENSES ONE YEAR.

Apartments Secured in the Despain Block for Reading, Social, Bath and Recreation Rooms and a Series of Lectures and Religious Talks to be Provided.

To the Public:—The canvas began a month ago for funds to furnish rooms and pay current expenses for one year for a "Men's Resort," has met with such success that it is now an assured thing. A suite of rooms has been secured in the Despain block and a first-class reading room, amusement parlors and shower baths will be fitted up and ready for business about July 1st.

The work that will be undertaken will be about as follows. The reading room will be kept open every day and evening from 9 a. m. to 10 p. m. and all men will be cordially welcome to use it. The bath rooms will be open to members every day and evening except Sunday. The social parlors will also be open to members all the time. A men's gospel meeting will be held every Sunday afternoon at 4 o'clock and men of all classes and all shades of religious belief and those having no belief will meet on an equal footing. The meeting will consist of gospel singing, short addresses by the resident pastors and Christian laymen and when possible, visiting workers of note will be secured.

A week night meeting will be held and business and professional men will be invited to give practical talks to men on various subjects. Classes in Bible study, vocal music and other branches will be organized. This work is largely an experiment and its failure has been predicted before it is begun. There is but one hope for it, if it meets a need in the social and moral life of the men of Pendleton it ought to succeed and it will succeed; if it does not do this we doubt it.

Three things are necessary to make it succeed: First, the moral and financial support of the community. Second, wise and efficient management of all its affairs by its superintendent. Third, a suitable place to carry on its work. The latter has been secured. We have reasonable ground to believe the former is assured, and if experience in such work and a determination to make this a success count for anything, the present superintendent guarantees the rest. The membership fee will be \$1 for initiation and 50 cents monthly dues. Anyone of good moral character over 15 years of age may join.
