The American Congress of Tuberculosis, which has been in session in New York, adopted a resolution declaring tuberculosis "an acute infectious disease, also the following res-

> "Resolved, by the American Congress of Tuberculosis. That the health authorities be urged to disseminate to the widest extent possibe through the press and otherwise correct information as to the manner in which this disease is produced and the means to be employed for its prevention.

'Resolved; That we believe it to be the duty of the national, state and municipal governments to enact rational methods for the prevention of tuberculosis, and we recommend the establishment of institutions for the care of indigent consumptives,
