## THE BIG GOLCONDA

### JAMES A. HOWARD TALKS REGARDING THE PROPERTY.

Says It Has the Biggest High-Grade Ore Bodies in the Camp—Three Feet of \$150 Ore—Red Boy Property Is Looking Very Fine.

James A. Howard, secretary of the Red Boy Consolidated Gold Mines Company, and also of the Golconda Consolidated Gold Mines Company, has recently returned from a two weeks' visit at the properties of the companies in which he is interested. Seen by a representative of the East Oregonian, he reported things in the camp in general in first-class shape. At the Red Boy everything is running smoothly with a full force of men and the Concord ground, recently acquired by the consolidated company, is being rapidly opened up, showing up some splendid mineralization. Both the Blaine and Helen

veins of that ground are disclosing large bodies of high-grade milling ore.

The ore of the Red Boy is also showing up better than for several months past, the mill is doing better than last summer and, taking it all in all, this property is looking more promising than for a long time. The lack of more marked improvement in the showing of the Red Boy is due to the fact that since February 1 a great deal of dead work has been done in drifting and opening up the Concord ground.

Asked if it was the intention of the company to continue deep sinking in the main shaft and put in the Olive creek water power during the present summer, Mr. Howard stated that arrangements were being perfected as rapidly as possible, the consummation of which would mean the sinking of the shaft at least 1000 feet deeper and the completion of the Olive creek water power plant so the company can develop at least 2000 horse-power. The company hopes and believes that it will be able to get both of these enterprises well under way during the present summer and fall.

Speaking of the Golconda, he said that the reports appearing in the newspapers regarding this property were substantially correct. Development there is disclosing high-grade ore beyond the most sanguine hopes and expectations of the purchasers.

In addition to the fact that the management has been able to follow up the rich shoot disclosed by the workings of the Messrs. English, the most important disclosure has been the opening of a rich shoot at the tunnel level, immediately off the collar of the shaft.

"To the south of this level," said Mr. Howard, "we have opened a shoot of high-grade sulphide ore averaging \$150 across the three feet lying along the wall. We have now plenty of ore to start the mill, a 20-stamp concentrator plant, and it is only a question of policy as to whether the mill shall be started within a month or six weeks or not."

"Taken all in all, the Golconda, in my opinion, is developing more high-grade ore in proportion to the amount of work done than any other mine in the camp.

"It is only a question as to whether we will be able to hang on to the

ore shoot, and as to its continuity, how large and valuable the property will become."
