## AGAIN POSTPONED

MEETING WILL BE HELD SATURDAY FOR ITS FORMATION.

Manager of Walla Walla Team Could Not Be Here — Pomeroy Beaten Again—Pendleton Team Has Won 34 Games.

The meeting for the formation of the proposed fall season league has again been postponed, a telegram having been received last night from Manager Sharpstein, of the Walla Walla team, that he could not be here until Saturday evening, so the meeting has been put off until then. At the meeting there will be Manager Sharpstein, of the Walla Walla Sharpshooters; Moritz, of the Dayton Dusters; Ray, of the La Grande Beet Pullers; Bashe, of the Baker City team, and Cohen, of the Pendleton Indians.

Much interest is being manifested in all the towns which are liable to join in the new league, and a fine series of games can be arranged with the teams which are sure to be in the organization.

### Indians Scalped Pomeroy.

A dispatch received from Captain Ziegler, of the Indians, last evening, says that Pendleton won the game with Pomeroy yesterday by a score of 6 to 5. Two batteries were used by the Indians, Taylor and Brown, and Hayes and Rhea. The telegram also states that it was a tough proposition with Reed in the box for Pomeroy. The team may be home tonight.

### An Unintentional Error.

Pendleton may well be proud of her Indians, for they are certainly the champions of Eastern Washington and have a record which any baseball organization might well be proud of. Since leaving home on their present trip, they have won seven games without losing one, and out of 43 games which they have played this season they have lost but nine.

### WALLA WALLA BEAT DAYTON

DUSTERS WERE CLEANED OUT IN A CLOSE GAME.

Ruckers Rogers the Escaped Convict, Is Still at Large and Will Probably Escape Entirely.

Walla Walla, June 26.—Walla Walla played better ball yesterday afternoon than she has played for weeks, and in consequence took the game from Dayton, with a score of 2 to 1. Dayton came over with a crowd of enthusiastic fans, arriving on a special train about noon. The train returned last night at 7 o'clock. From the opening of the game Dayton was easily outclassed, but good ball was played, with no errors of expensive character. The local team has been sloppy for several games, but yesterday the boys arose to the occasion and played a game of the usual sort when the team stood well among the teams of the inland section.

Jesse Ferney, proprietor of the Walla Walla Rubber Stamp factory, and Miss Mabel Broxon, of this city, were married yesterday at the home of the bride, on Sumach street. Rev. Lee A. Johnson officiated and a number of relatives were present.

Rucker Rogers, the convict who escaped from the state penitentiary last Sunday, is still at large and is presumed to be in hiding in the woods near Milton, Or. A number of men are still trying to find trace of him, but he has eluded everyone so far.

### PORTLAND TAKES LEAD.

Now Has Good Claim to Control of Pacific Northwest Trade.

Discussing the controversy that has existed in a commercial way between Seattle and Tacoma on one side and Portland on the other as to the control of traffic on the Northwest coast, a well-known railway president whose headquarters are on the Pacific Coast, stated to a friend not long since that the scale had now turned decidedly in favor of Portland. This is what he had to say about it:

"For a few months past the traffic on the Sound has, perhaps, been slightly in excess of that through the port of Portland. It is different now and will be decidedly different in the future in Portland's favor. The advantage the Sound had over Portland was the cheap coal brought to it by vessels from San Francisco, and which enabled the Sound ports to coal the big steamers at much less cost than they could coal at Portland. Seattle and Tacoma also had cheaper coal almost at their doors in the Rosslyn mines.

"Since the discovery of oil in

California and its use for fuel the shipments of coal to this coast as ballast from Australia has largely fallen off. This has thrown the balance of power to Portland, as the fuel question is now about on an equality.

"Should oil be discovered in Eastern Oregon and the coalbeds opened up on the western coast of Oregon, Portland would control the shipping business of the Northwest, and, with the increased traffic facilities to the interior now rapidly being carried out in connection with the Columbia river route, nothing can hold back the progress of the state of Oregon and its chief city and shipping port. These are some of the points lost sight of, but which every Oregon man at least should study carefully and be prepared to assist in developing. It takes unity of action to accomplish anything, and if the people of this state stand together, like the people of Washington have, on any and every proposition, they will make of it the greatest empire in the world."
