Two Companies Now Want to Build Road There.

Milton, July 2.—Milton citizens are now very much elated over the prospects of having an electric railway in the near future. Between the Romo-Mellmann electric road proposed from Dayton to Pendleton, which is to tap this city, and O. R. Ballou, promoter of the Ballou electric road from Walla Walla to Milton, it looks very much as though one line or the other would be built.

The Romo-Mellmann company have been before the council of this place and the city officials are only waiting to see what Walla Walla does. If the proposition is looked upon with favor and everything granted in that city the people of this place will follow suit without any question. It is also understood that the city officials of Freewater, just across the road, will also grant the franchise to Romo and Mellmann. They seem to be in the lead now but M. Ballou has been before the council and is asking that he be granted a franchise

**JOHN COX MAY RECOVER**

OPERATION HAS PROBABLY SAVED HIS LIFE

Pressure on the Spinal Cord has Been Removed and Injured Man is Much Improved.

There is a possibility that John Cox will get well. Mr. Cox is the man who was thrown from a wagon on Camas Creek and received a fractured back bone. He was brought to Pendleton Tuesday and taken to the Sisters' hospital where an operation was performed in the afternoon by Surgeons Brooke, of Portland, and Cole, of Pendleton.

The operation was performed with the possibility of its saving Mr. Cox's life which was despaired of otherwise. The operation showed that the bone was injured and two small pieces were removed, taking the pressure from the spinal cord.

As soon as Mr. Cox recovered from the influence of the anesthetic he appeared much relieved by the operation and has continued to improve ever since. Before the operation he was paralyzed from the arm pits down and now he has a slight feeling down to the hips.

All is being done that is possible to modern surgery and if there is a possibility of saving the life of a man in the condition of Mr. Cox it will be done; although, while the chances have been against him up to the time of the operation, they are now very favorable.

**Mellmann in Pendleton.**

Mr. Mellmann, of the proposed electric railway line from Dayton to Pendleton, arrived in town this afternoon from Walla Walla. He is here to push his franchise through the county court, now in session and to bring it before the city council tonight. The council of Walla Walla granted the franchise last night and Mr. Mellmann and Romo put up the \$2000 bonds to the city.
