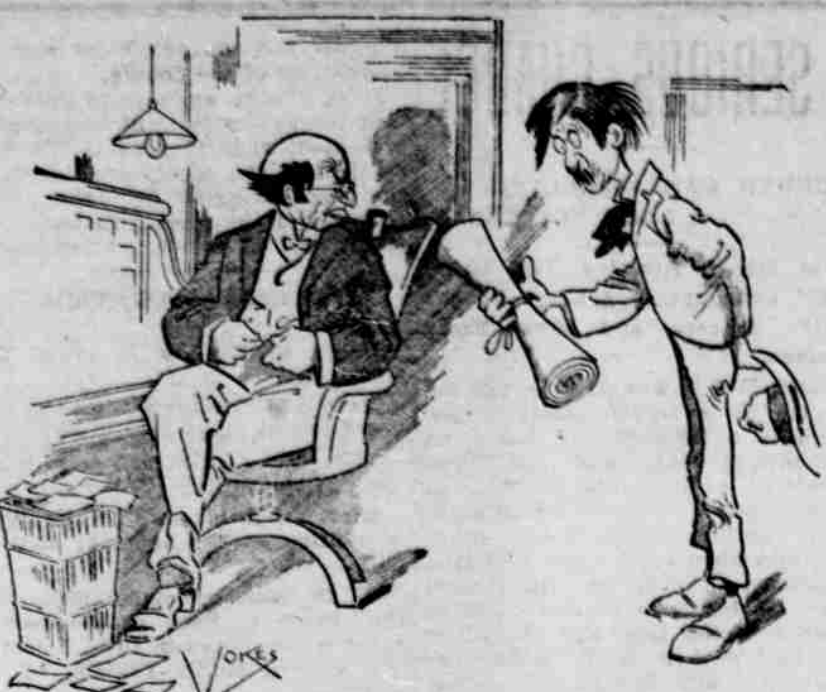

STOCK RANCH ON AN ISLAND

BIG RANCH DEVELOPING IN COLUMBIA RIVER

Bialock Island is Being Stocked With Cattle and Many Head Will Be Raised There.

Bialock Island, on the Columbia river, is fast developing into a stock ranch. Several years ago Dr. Bialock, of Walla Walla, began to improve this island with the intention of making a fruit ranch out of it. Since that he has gradually been turning it into a stock ranch and at the present time the company back of the proposition has 180 acres in alfalfa. This grows to perfection on the island and from three to four crops can be harvested each year.

It gets very warm and the company has an irrigation plant on the river which is used for watering the island. With plenty of water anything will grow, the alfalfa growing and maturing so rapidly and making so many crops a year, makes the most profitable thing which can be grown.

The coming fall from 200 to 300 head of heifers will be placed in pasturage on the island and it is possible that several head may be taken there to fatten for the market. In speaking of the object of the company in charge of the island, Wellington Clark, manager of the company, said recently:

"We have but 180 acres of alfalfa growing at the present time, but hope to enlarge the acreage later. That is all there is room for now. The pump which is being used to raise water from the river and irrigate the island is running 12 hours a day and discharging 700 gallons of water per minute into the pipes and troughs which carry it to the various parts of the tract. This means irrigation is giving perfect satisfaction. The quantity of water can of course be increased at any time, either by working the present pump double shifts or by putting in another piece of machinery.

"It is the intention of the company to stock the island this fall and begin at once breeding stock. At the end of two years it is estimated the increase will have been sufficient to comfortably populate the island with bovine kind. From that time on the well fattened animals will be disposed of to the Portland and other market, the number of cattle on hand being regulated by the supply of feed and the capacity of the island."

Big Land Boom in Northwest.

Minneapolis, Minn., July 11.—In order to convince the farmers that corn can be grown successfully in the northwest, Minnesota and North Dakota land men and railway industrial agents are promoting a large number of experiments in the Red River Valley and various section of North Dakota. This has resulted in a considerable increase in corn acreage in the valley, 500,000 acres being the estimated corn acreage in North Dakota this year. The experiments are progressing satisfactorily and the indications are that the coming year as a result will witness the largest land movement in the history of the north west.

La Grande, July 12.—An exciting incident occurred here Thursday evening when John F. Shaw, a Montana man, who had been called here by

the illness of relatives, was held up one one of our main streets and robbed of \$136 within a few moments of the time he landed in the city. He had left the train and started to the home of his relatives, when he was suddenly confronted by two men with a big gun, who demanded and got all the money and other valuables he had on him. He gave the alarm as soon as he could get away from the hold-up men, but by the time the police arrived the robbers had escaped.




