Brisbois-St. Dennis.

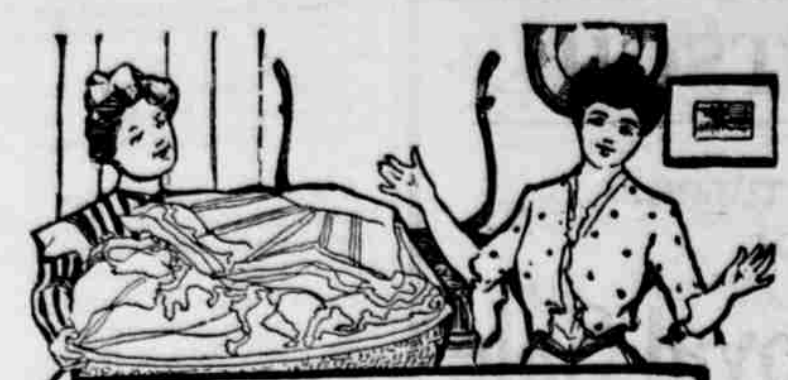
