CRUELTY TO ANIMALS.

Teams Left in Hot Sun Without Feed or Water.

Frank Frazier should have credit for his thoughtfulness to dumb animals. Last Saturday morning a horse was tied to a post near Hotel Pendleton and left there all day without feed or water. Mr. Frazier saw the animal and concluded that he would see that it got something to eat and drink.

Accordingly, he untied the animal and took it into the Froome livery stable, where its wants were looked after. Late in the evening the owner came to get his horse to ride home and it was gone. Someone told him where to find it and he had to pay for the care of the animal before he could get it out of the barn. This served him right. Had it cost him \$10 it would not have been too much.

A man who will tie an animal in the broiling hot sun when the thermometer is registering above 100 in the shade and leave it from early morning to night, should be prosecuted and not let off with the price of the care of the animal. This thing is getting pretty frequent in Pendleton.

It is not infrequent for saddle horses and teams to be tied to a post in town and remain there from early noon to late in the afternoon and then be driven home without feed or water. This should be looked after and every man who does it should be prosecuted. There is a law against cruelty to animals and this will come under that head. If Pendleton had a society for the prevention of cruelty to animals such things would be looked after.

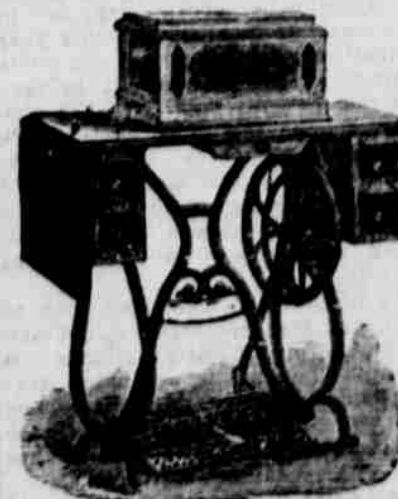
