WHO OWNS TEAM?

GOOD OUTFIT LEFT AT LIV-
ERY STABLE, UNCLAIMED.

Man Drove Into Barn a Week Ago,
Left the Team With Instructions
to "Feed Them Hay," and Dis-
appeared.

William Semple, the livery stable man, with the assistance of the sheriff's office, is trying to locate a man who brought a team and buggy to his barn last Thursday, the 17th instant, and has not shown up to claim the team since.

The man drove up to the barn about 9 o'clock in the morning and getting out of the buggy, told the boy who came to care for the team, to "feed them hay."

This was all the man said. Then he went away. The young man who took the team did not pay any attention to the fellow further than to see that he was a young man, perhaps 25 years of age.

The team has been in the barn since, and Mr. Semple kept thinking daily that the owner would show up and get them, but after almost a week had elapsed and no one claimed the team, he began an investigation, but without results as yet.

Is a Good Team.

The team will weigh about 1050 pounds each, one is a black mare, branded JWS on the right shoulder, the other a brown gelding with a large square branded on the right hip, while the buggy is a good top rig, and all indicate having come from a farm rather than a livery stable.

All kinds of suggestions have been offered as to the cause of the team being left there so long. Some thing it might be a stolen outfit, while others wonder why the owner does not show up if it was and claim his team.

The sheriff's office has wired to all the neighboring towns and made diligent search for any man who might have had a team stolen, but this has proven a fruitless hunt.

Theories Advanced.

Some hold to the idea that the man drove the team to the barn, went away on the train, expecting to return that evening and something has happened to him to detain him, while still others think the man is a farmer who has driven to town, put his team in the barn and done away with himself.

Foul play has also been suggested, but no one can answer the question "whose team is it?"
