MORE RANGERS.

Additional Guardians of the Forest Named by Hermann.

Secretary Hitchcock, of the department of the interior, upon the recommendation of Commissioner Binger Hermann, has appointed 9 additional rangers for service this year on the Oregon forest reserve. The last appointees were: John A. W. Heidecke, Detroit; B. Gates Cochran, Salem; E. G. White, Salem; A. L. Morris, Harrisburg; Newton J. Ferril, Salem; G. W. Taylor, Macleay; Wm. H. Hesilman, Minto; Henry Foster Sisters, and Ephraim Henness, Detroit. The men have not yet been assigned districts, but it is presumed

their instructions will accompany their commissions.

Under the new system of caring for the forest reserve of the state, Oregon was divided into districts, each district to be guarded by 25 rangers. Only 29 rangers have thus far been announced, and if the original plan is adhered to, other appointments may be expected soon.
