#### GENERAL NEWS.

Lord Kitchener has been presented by the citizens of Cape Town with a sword of honor.

The Santa Fe railway has just placed an order for \$1,000,000 worth of new equipment.

May Yohe is in London and says she will forgive Captain Strong if he will say he is sorry.

A large number of cave-dwellers have been discovered along the Yellow River, in China.

A fire at Glenwood, Col., Thursday, destroyed half a block of frame buildings and did about \$10,000 worth of damage.

The time for the building of seven new submarine boats now under course of construction for the United States government, has been extended.

Mrs. Victoria Gibson, of Butler, Ind., is under arrest charged with obtaining money fraudulently through the operation of a fake matrimonial bureau.

The old Stevens House, a landmark of Bowling Green, N. Y., is to be torn down to make room for a new \$9,000,000 office building which will be the largest in the world.

The richest community of negroes in the United States are the Creek negroes, living in the Indian territory. There are 7000 of them and their average wealth is better than \$3000.

Dr. Charles Kendall Adams, of Madison, Wis., who in his will provides for the endowment of the University of Wisconsin with \$150,000, is found upon investigation to have left an estate of but \$30,000.

A ruling has just been made by the attorney-general of the Hawaiian Islands, compelling ex-Queen Liliuokalani to pay an income tax of \$150 per annum on her annual allowance of \$7500 granted by the Hawaiian legislature.

Alfred E. Rhodes, an employe of the Cudahy Packing Company, was electrocuted in a refrigerator car at Butte, Mont., Thursday, by coming in contact with a stray electric current. When the coroner entered the car he was also struck by a heavy current and almost killed.

Nathan S. Porter, a resident of Olympia, Wash., will succeed Jacob Weatherwax, deceased, as grand high priest of the Royal Arch Masons, for the districts of Washington and Oregon.

Every member of the family of J. J. Robinson, of Aberdeen, Wash., is violently ill as a result of eating what is supposed to have been tainted meat. They have acute symptoms of ptomaine poisoning.

County Superintendent W. M. Miller has made up his annual report, from which it is learned that the number of inhabitants of Lane county of school age is 7755. Of these, 3979 are males and 3776 are females.

Pendleton's Pets Play Pranks  
With Portland's Ex-players, While Baker Poorly Protected Their Pitcher.

The Indians had an easy task Friday afternoon in walking off with the second of the series with the Baker City Gold Diggers, although the game was at times fast and as a rule extremely interesting, some nice plays being made on both sides.

Willard, the Baker twirler, did good work, but had poor support, while Hays, for Pendleton, was up to his usual excellence and was accorded first-rate support.

The men from the mines had a hard time of it up until the fifth, only three men reaching first, but in that round Brown hit a hot one to Fay, who fielded it neatly, but threw wild to first, the ball bounding over the fence and allowing Brown to make the round of the bases. In the ninth the Diggers made another tour of the bases, Crawford scoring from third base before a long fly pulled down in center by Hammond could be returned to the plate.

#### Pendleton Did Stunts.

There was nothing doing for Pendleton in the first, but in the second, third, fourth and fifth they got one each, making four, and in the seventh they ran amuck and trotted three men across home plate, totaling seven tallies in all.

The first two runs were scored on errors. The third was earned in the fourth inning, Wilner hitting for two bags and being brought home by Rhea and Hays, both of whom went out in the endeavor. In the fifth Stovall hit hard to center field and the ball was misjudged by Hupp, "Big Fellow" making the tour of the bags before the ball got home. The three runs in the seventh were made with two men down. Schills got to second on a muff of Ferris, Fay hit safe. Stovall flew out to Ferris and Schmidt to Clemens, Hammond was passed to first, Ferris failed to handle Adams' grounder, Schills and Fay scoring on this error, and Hammond scoring from second on Willard's wild pitch.

#### Good Field Work.

The star fielding performance was Hammond's running catch of Woods' long fly to center, Hammond running under the ball and then jumping up and backward for it, making the most difficult catch on the grounds this season.

#### Hupp Was Strenuous.

Hupp accepted some hard chances in center, but his insulting and ungentlemanly behavior during the game so aroused the animosity of the audience that nothing but jeers and cat-calls were accorded his best efforts, while he was greeted with cheers when he was stepped on and his hand hurt while sliding to second. Mr. Hupp may be a very good ball player, but he has a lot to learn yet about how to behave himself as a gentleman, his conduct in both games already played being disgusting and an insult to every woman on the grounds. A stop will have to be put to this kind of work if ball games are to draw crowds in this city. Daniel Shea was had enough, but he is a white-winged angel of peace alongside Mr. Daniel Hupp.

#### Other Features.

Mahaffey at first for Baker, made a fine stop with one hand of a wild throw by Brown and did other good work, but kicked a little too much to suit the fans who like clean ball playing. He has not yet forgotten the fact that he played in the Northwest League and it affects him somewhat. George Brown at short did good

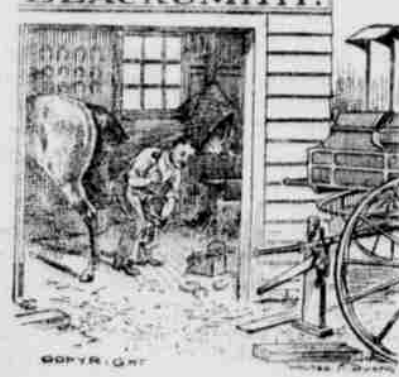
