In the matter of decoration, it might be said that even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed as is the busines section of San Francisco AMES A. FEE, LAW OFFICE IN JUDD today. On every hand, over doors and windows, spanning the streets, or floating from tall staffs, are the well known emblems of the order, with a plentiful profusion of the stars and stripes. The public buildings, private residences and business blocks alike are gayly decorated, while across many of the principal streets are magnificent arches. Van Ness avenue, the broadest and finest residence street of the city, has been transformed into one grand fair for the entire length of 35 blocks on each side of which every county of California has an elaborate and interesting exhibit
