STOCK INSPECTOR

OF DISEASED ANIMALS.

District Attorney Hailey Gives an Opinion at Request of Judge Hart-

County Judge G. A. Hartman, having been besieged with inquiries in regard to the duties of county stock inspectors in cases of diseased and mals called upon District Attorney Halley for an epinion on the subject which is published in full as follows: Pendleton, Or., Sept. 20, 1902.

Hon G. A. Hertman, County Judge.

"Dear Sir:- Your favor of the 20th ast received, requesting a written laws thien from me regarding the duty that numerous complaints about dis paly ased horses have reached you in the ast rew days involving cases of mange and other diseases in several places north of Pendleton, and in answer thereto I will state that section we of an act to prevnt the suread of ontagious animal diseases, found on page 1889 of the second votume of Hill's Code provides is shall be the dust of the stock inspector of each county and of each local inspector who discovers, suspects, or has reason to believe that any domesti animal or animals in his county or incality is affected with any dangerous contagious disease to immediate ly report such fact to the state veter harian. And the following section as amended by the act of February 1895, province that upon receipt of such information from a stock in spector, the state veterinarian shall immediately examine or deputize a competent person to examine all and mais reported to be diseased, and if he finds such animals are infected with contagious or infectious disease he shall promptly take such measures as he shall deem expedient or percessary to prevent the spread of

Walla the general act Section 3350, of Hill's Code provides that the stock inspector of each county, in addition to the examination of sheep as therein mentioned shall also camming free of charge, any other kind of livestock in his county at any time he may be called upon to do so by request in writing of at least to persons owning or nontrolling stock of the class he is by such persons called upon to examine and such persons making a written statement that their stock is affected Mrs. Kumm, and family. And his duty as stock inspector applies as much to cattle, horses and other animals as to sheep, except that the law does lay down specific duties which shall be performed by him at certain times with regard to sheep,
