## BRISCOBOIS IS DEAD

DEATH CAME SUDDENLY TO FAMOUS INDIAN POLICE.

Attained Notoriety on the Umatilla Indian Reservation—Was a Faithful and Energetic Officer.

Ed Briscobois, perhaps one of the best known Umatilla reservation Indians, died at the Central lodging house in this city this morning at 1:30.

Briscobois has been sick for the past several months, but he was not thought to be in a serious condition. Several months ago he went to North Yakima and remained until a week ago, when he returned to Pendleton. From here he went to the reservation and yesterday was brought to town to receive medical aid. He was very sick, but death came suddenly and unexpectedly this morning.

Briscobois was the son of Oliver Briscobois, one of the old Hudson Bay trappers, and was born in Marion county, Oregon, in 1852. His father was a Frenchman and his mother was a descendant of the now almost extinct Chinook Indians. When Ed Briscobois was a small boy his parents removed to Walla Walla, where the Hudson's Bay Company had headquarters, and remained there for several years. Later, when Ed was a young man, he became identified with the Umatilla Indians and has resided on the reservation most of the time since. He was chief of police on the reserve for many years and while acting in this capacity he gained the enmity of a few of the lawless element of the Umatillas, but as a general rule, he was well thought of. He was a quiet fellow and in his capacity as police officer he did much to eliminate lawlessness from the reserve.

Briscobois was married on the Umatilla reservation, but he and his wife have not been living together. They had one child.

The body is now in the undertaking parlors of M. A. Rader, but so arrangements have been made for the funeral or burial.

Peter McIntyre in Justice Court—Two Boys Injured.

Athens, Oct. 14.—In Justice Chamberlain's court Monday Peter McIntyre was given a hearing on the charge of threatening violence and great bodily harm to Mrs. Margaret Duffy. After quite a heated preliminary the defendant was discharged and the costs taxed against the prosecutor. Will M. Peterson appeared as attorney for McIntyre.
