GOLCONDA MINE

COMPLETE OUTFIT OF MACHINERY INSTALLED.

Holds Milling Record of the District, Ten Stamps Averaging Over Five Tons a Day—Pendleton Capital Interested.

The management of the Golconda mine, near Sumpter, of which so many people in Pendleton are interested, is arranging to put in new machinery. In speaking of this well-known property, the Blue Mountains American has the following to say:

The hoist, cages, engine, boilers, pump and other apparatus recently sold to the Golconda company by C. H. Fisher, to replace the ones now on the property, will begin arriving shortly. They will be put in place at an early date, thus enlarging the capacity for handling ore from the lower levels, and will undoubtedly result in placing the other 10 stamps in commission at an early date. The old hoist has not been disposed of yet, but will probably be taken up by some of the smaller properties. The new hoist is good for a depth of 1200 feet.

Holds Milling Record.

For a hard, silicious ore, it is believed that the Golconda mine has the milling record for the district. The 10 stamps dropping there are averaging five tons per day, and even more. This is a tremendous quantity of ore, and as experts have remarked, exceeds the mill practice of this district by nearly 50 per cent. Such work as this will count when the big properties of the district are made to output enormous quantities of ore. In the past the grade of ore has been too high to give much attention to milling methods, for there was so much ore that some of it had to be saved. New milling practices, greater economy in power and in fact, general improvements along the line of mechanical engineering is looked forward to with interest by all eager to see highest developments here. South Africa has held the general record for five tons per stamp, but conditions favored there. At the Golconda the ore is hard and all but 40 to 70 cents of the values are saved. The concentrates run high and a good per cent is saved on the plates.

FACES A GRAVE CRISIS.

Exciting Scenes in Parliament Expected—Opens Today.

London, Oct. 16.—Everything indicates that the autumn session of parliament, which opened today, will witness intensely exciting debates. Three questions of the highest importance are to come before the house of commons—the educational bill, the South African settlement and the Irish bill. Upon these the opposition will make a fierce fight. It is freely admitted that the new ministry faces a grave situation and the developments are eagerly awaited.

For the moment there is a lull in the discussion as to South Africa, and the educational issue holds the field. The nonconformists throughout the country are pledging themselves to refuse to pay school taxes if the bill passes in its present shape, as a protest against the grants proposed to be made under it to schools in which sectarian religion is taught. Nearly 200 free church councils in various parts of the country have adopted resolutions of defiance and forwarded them to the premier. Many municipal councils controlled by nonconformist majorities have formally decided that if the bill passes they will refuse to obey the direction with respect to taking over from the school boards the management of schools. Nothing in the history of modern England approaches this for organized resistance to an act of parliament. As Mr. Balfour's reputation is bound up with the measure it is a matter of life and death to him. The problem is a hard one and may upset the ministry, which would mean a dissolution of parliament. If parliament should be dissolved a liberal victory in the elections is deemed certain. Then King Edward would

send for Lord Roseberry to organize a government. If the earl should even succeed in forming a ministry with a working majority behind it politicians are very doubtful if it could last long.

Between this education bill difficulty and the Irish question the path of Mr. Balfour and his associates appears thorny indeed. Eight Irish members of parliament already are in jail under the coercion act and six others have been summoned to appear before the crimes act courts. It is the general opinion, however, that such shallow expedients are of no permanent value and something of a weightier character will have to be done if the problem is to be solved at all.

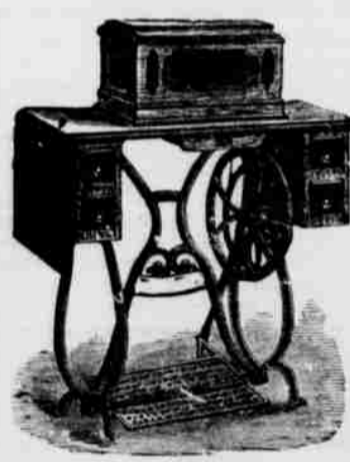

GENERAL NEWS.

The meat packers' combine will be launched December 1. All of the large packers of Chicago will be merged.

General Funston says the Fort Riley maneuvers were extremely valuable to the army, and that they should be repeated each year.

Editor Kelley, who shot Dr. Cayley at Butte the other day, has been placed under \$1500 bonds. Cayley is in a precarious condition.

The library at Hawarden, erected as a national monument to the memory of the late William E. Gladstone, and which cost \$50,000, was opened by Earl Spencer Wednesday.

An earthquake and tidal wave did great damage to many coast towns in Mexico and Central America the last of September. The damage to the port of Ocos will amount to several millions.

The powers have notified the ports of their compliance with Turkey's request to make representations to the Bulgarian government urging a better surveillance of the Turko-Bulgarian frontier.

The navy department lately cabled \$15,000 to Manila, P. I., to be sent from there to the island of Guam for the rehabilitation of the naval station property, which was damaged by a recent earthquake.

The police lately raided five alleged gambling houses in the tenderloin district of New York, and as a result more than 500 prisoners were taken to the station. Among the houses raided was that of which "Honest" John Kelly is the alleged proprietor.

PACIFIC NORTHWEST NEWS.

The work of taking eggs on the Columbia River by the United States fish commission, has ceased for the season. At the four stations over 20,000,000 eggs were taken.

The formal opening exercises of Willamette University at Salem, were held Tuesday afternoon, when Bishop Cranston delivered an address before the students and faculty.

In the United States circuit court at Spokane, Judge C. H. Hanford issued permanent injunction forbidding certain members of the Cooks' and Waiters' Union or their associates to interfere with the restaurant business conducted by K. Takahashi, a Japanese.

D. W. Tindall returned lately to Payette, Idaho, from Indian Valley, in Washington county, where his sheep have been ranging. He reports very heavy losses sustained by himself and others by poison, apparently put out for the purpose of destroying the sheep. Mr. Tindall says he has lost 600 head, E. V. Currin 300, W. A. Myers, 500, and several others from 100 to 250.

A sheep herder named Eber Scranton, at Weiser, Idaho, whose actions seemed those of a crazy man, was brought before the insanity board, but after examination was declared to be sane. He was then arrested and taken before a justice of the peace on the charge of shooting with intent to kill. He had fired five shots at James Moony, foreman of a large sheep outfit, for which Scranton had been working.
