WARDEN'S REPORT

HOLBROOK DITCH COMPANY
KEEPS FISH FROM UMATILLA.

Their Dam a Complete Stop to Fish Ascending the River, Nearly the Entire Year.

"Across the Umatilla river, a mile and a half from its mouth the Holbrook Ditch Company have a dam for the purpose of diverting the water from the river into their ditch for irrigation purposes. This dam is only two and one-half feet high, and is no obstruction to fish ascending or descending the stream during high water, but, as this stream is high only a very small portion of the time, the dam is sufficiently high, being constructed on a flat bed of rock, to be a complete stop to fish ascending the river nearly the entire year, and during the extreme dry portion of the year, all the water that the river carries is taken from the river bed into the irrigating ditch, leaving practically no water to flow down the river bed from this dam to the mouth of the river excepting what little leaks through the dam and through their ditch flume, which is a very trifling amount. From investigations made, I find that, during high water, a sand bar forms at the mouth of this river and that when the waters in the Columbia recedes this sand bar completely closes the mouth of the Umatilla, and that, during the dry season, while the water is practically all taken from the river for irrigation purposes, there are months at a time that no water from the Umatilla flows into the Columbia. The river bed from the dam to the sand bar at the mouth of the river is of a lava or bed rock formation. Above the dam the river is quite a little stream, and is bountifully supplied with trout and other fish, but how are we going to maintain it as a trout and fish stream with the waters all practically taken for irrigating purposes will remain to be seen. The people on the upper waters interested in 'fish' are very anxious about the matter and think that fish should be privileged the stream as heretofore. I met Mr. F. B. Holbrook, manager of the ditch company, and notified him relative to the law governing such matters, and he assured me that he would comply with it fully and furnish a fishway through the dam admitting fish at all stages of the season.

La Grande Hatchery.

"At La Grande, the La Grande Electric Light and Power Company have a dam across the Grande river for power purposes. This dam is about 14 feet high, and I found it to be a complete obstruction, though it is provided with a flush gate that they allow to remain open during certain stages of the water, through which, they contend that fish can ascend and descend the river. I notified them that it was not a legal affair and that they would have to provide the dam with the 'Improved Gill System' of fishway. Mr. Joseph Palmer, the manager of the company, assured me that this would be done, and that immediate steps would be taken towards getting it in.

"Below this dam a few hundred yards, the Ore Ditch Company have a wing dam extending entirely across the river, made of loose rock and brush, as a lead for their irrigating ditch. It was not more than a foot high, but for all that, was a complete obstruction and one of those

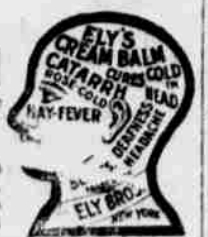

very common irrigating ditch death-traps to any fish attempting to descend the stream.

"Above the dam of the La Grande Electric Light and Power Company, the Grande Ronde Lumber Company have three or four dams in across the Grande Ronde river, for logging and milling purposes. I have notified them relative to the law, and will insist on their complying with it and furnishing good and sufficient fishways for each dam.

Grande Ronde Hatchery.

"October 21st I visited the Grande Ronde River Hatchery Station and found that Superintendent Allen had been successful in securing 3,000,000 Chinook eggs. The season was practically over for this variety, though he still had more 'Chinooks' within his enclosure, but not enough to affect his number very materially. At this station he also expects to get a large number of Sockeye eggs, and from the number of Sockeye salmon that he had enclosed, I see no reason why he should not do as well with them this season as he did last and probably will do better for, present indications seem to be better this year for this variety of salmon than what they were last year.

"This is a promising stream for our work, but for anything permanent I think we should endeavor to get away from the moss which this year proved very expensive to us, and which is liable at all times to be very serious for, if it should come along at any time when there is the least of a freshet in the river, it would be impossible to maintain and hold a set of racks across the river. That we might better our condition and get away from the worst of this moss, I went over the entire river and its principal tributaries with Mr. Allen, and from what we found, I think it would be better for us if we were further up the stream of which there are two very good sized ones, and if the necessary rights and privileges can be secured, I think we should endeavor to do this another season.

Ontario Hatchery.

"At the Ontario Hatchery Station they are in the midst of their Chinook egg-taking season, and up to the present date had succeeded in taking 7,756,000 eggs from 1636 female salmon. Frank Brown, superintendent in charge, figures that he has fully as many more salmon enclosed between racks yet to spawn and will without doubt double the present number reported.

Five Days' Record.

"During the last five days of the month the number of female salmon spawned each day averaged 174; the largest number spawned any one day was October 30th, when they spawned 210 females, from which they took 1,029,000 eggs; October 31st was the next largest day, 873,000 eggs having been taken from 180 females.
