Water power will be used for the electric light plant as the fall of the Umatilla river is ample to furnish all that is needed This river will also be used to supply e new system, in case it is built.

#### Churches and Lodges.

Freewater has two splendid church buildings. Neither have pastors at present, but a union Sunday school is conducted regularly and it is expected to hold services regularly at both churches at an early day. Congregational church organization has a building valued at \$800 and has \$500 in bank, the proceeds of the sale of property which the church did not need.
