

# POSTPONED

NOT YET ANNONCED.

Examinations Made in October, But Postmaster Has Not Been Advised as to Appointments.

Postmaster Lot Livermore has not yet received notice of the appoint-ment of the carriers on the Pendle-ton free delivery route. The date of the commencement of free delivery was fixed, some time ago, for Decem-ber 1, but as it will be necessary for carriers to spend several days in fa-miliarizing themselves with the routes, it will be impossible for the plan to be inaugurated by that date even though the carriers were named

The examination papers of the ap-plicants for the position of carriers, were sent to the postoffice department in October, and the unusual de-lay in making the appointments will cause much disappointment to residents of Pendleton, who have long anticipated the benefits of this change. It is quite likely another month will now elapse before the be-ginning of the new system. However, all preparations are complete, so far as the Pendleton office is concerned, and free delivery will be in operation very sooon after the appointment of carriers is announced. tion has been furnished Mr. Liver more as to the cause of the delay, al-though the postoffice department has been wired that everything is in readiness at this office.

#### MESSENGER SERVICE.

Call Boxes to be Put in Places of Business and Messengers ployed.

Pendleton is to have the A. D. T. delivery service installed and in full working order within the next few weeks. Some of the instruments have arrived for the local Western Union office and the last installment of instruments and paraphernalia is expected at once.

The placing of the boxes will be completed soon and then the services of from six to ten messenger boys will be required to handle the work on the outside. Call boxes will be placed in all the prominent business houses and places where the services of a messenger boy is likely to be needed at any time. These boxes are put in and maintained at no expense to the customer as the company place the instruments, wires and call boxes at their own expense. All that is required of the patrons is for them to give the company their business. Not only will messages be delivered to any part of the city for a small sum, but business men having packages to deliver can have them delivered with-out delay,

#### DECEASED.

Umatilla County Industry Gives Up the Ghost With the Expiration of Land Notices.

With its issue last Thursday, the Ukiah Sentinel goes out of the business of publishing land notices. Its existence has been one glorious round of pleasure, if its oblituary, a column in length, is to be taken seriously. in the absence of news, it has run interesting stories of the wonderful vir-tues of some two dozen patent medicines, and decorated its columns with the soul-satifying timber land publication. It does not blame the county for its failure. It is simply a martyr to poor management, it states, and a victim of poor judgment in making a choice of location. While the timber land lasted in the vicinity of Ukiah, it flew high. But with the banishing area of the public domain tributary to its jurisdiction, its life beats hushed and its subscription list is broken off in the middle, like a half-told tale.
