BICYCLE ORDINANCE AMENDED.
Monthly Payment of License A-lished—Riders Will Now Pay for the Season in Advance.
The bicycle ordinance, recently passed by the city council has been amended. The law as passed made the license of 50 cents payable monthly from the 15th day of November to the 15th of April, and the amendment to the ordinance makes the license for the bicycle season payable in advance. The license for the six months is to be \$3, or in that proportion for the time the license is issued, all licenses to expire on the 15th of April.
