FEDERAL AUTHORITIES ISSUE NEW INSTRUCTIONS

Homesteaders Will Not be Allowed to Hold More Land Than They Can Use-Disappointment to Land Grab-

La Grande, Ore., Dec. 3.-Land of fices with districts including arid regions, where possibilities for govern ment irrigation projects exist, are receiving notices of instruction from the federal land department, designed to regulate the taking of homesteads under future government irrigation ditches. The idea prevails generally throughout the Northwest that a side tip on an area which the government proposes to irrigate will make it possible to take a homestsead or desert claim in that district, and thus secure 160 or 320 acres of valuable irrigated land for nothing.

#### To Foil the Land Grab.

Commissioner Hermann has announced that desert land entries will not be permitted at all in lands withdrawn for government irrigation. In addition, even if a man secures a 160acre homestead, he will have to take his chances on the government put ting the project through. If the pro-ject goes through, then the secretary of the interior will cut down the homestead to such acreage as he deems sufficient for the support of the homesteader and his family.

### The Rights of the People.

The object of the secretary of the interior in this action is stated to be the preservation of the rights of the many. The intent of the act of congress providing for irrigation funds was not to allow any lucky individual a big graft, but to provide homes for as many settlers as possible. To ac-complish this, no man is to be allow-ed 160 acres of land under a government ditch, but only enough to support himself and family. This nulli-

To Discuss the Warehouse Needs. Washington, D. C. Dec. 3.-The annual convention of the American Warehousemen's Association, which began here today and will continue through the rest of the week, will consider many subjects of interest to those engaged in the storage warehouse and refrigerating business. The association represents a capitalization of over \$50,000,000, with a member-ship of nearly 100, including all the leading warehouse people of the coun try. A committee is on hand from the convention of state commissioners or uniform laws, with a view of obtaining the opinion of the association as to legislation governing the Issue of storage warehouse receipts. The laws governing such receipts are so varied and conflicting that they seriously interfere with the proper conduct of the storage warehouse busi-ness. It is urged by the members of the association that the storage warehouse receipts ought to be good col-lateral, but this is impossible it is declared, until uniform laws are en-acted in all the states. Another inportant matter to receive attention at the convention is the subject of fire insurance. The rates fixed by the various tariff associations have been very unsatisfactory, and in so many instances the cold storage men have not been able to secure sufficient fire insurance at any price.
