BUYS SCHOOLHOUSE

KAMELA MAN FINDS AN OLD MISTAKE.

After Fifteen Years, it is Found That Deed Did Not Cover School House Site—No Dancing to Be Allowed in This Man's Building.

There is one school house in Umatilla county that is owned by a private person. It was built by the district, has been used continuously for 15 years as a public school building, yet a slight mistake in a deed makes it the property of the man who bought the land it stands upon.

About 15 years ago, when the population of Kamela was something like 500, a man named Corbett, deeded the district an acre of land on which to build a school house. The deed was accepted and a house costing \$800 was built. There were 50 scholars in Kamela at that time. The woods were settled up thickly with sawmill men, lumber and the makers, wood choppers and railroad graders. The school house has been the pride of the district for these long years, as the population has dwindled down to a shadow of its former self.

Two years ago E. Sawyer bought the Corbett land, and went to look into the records of that portion lying on the Union county side of the summit. He found that in making the deed to the one acre of land for the school house site, a mistake in the number of the range line had been made, placing the actual site six miles east of the land occupied by the Kamela school house.

As Mr. Sawyer had bought the land and all its appurtenances, the school house belonged to him and the district owned a lone acre down among the tamaracks, six miles from the town.

A contract was made with him by which, in consideration of \$10, a perpetual lease upon the house was secured—provided, however, that no dances, improper assemblages or riotous proceedings should ever mar its seating capacity.

He is a fiddler and often the young people try to arrange dancing parties in the building, at which he might preside as chief musician, but he religiously keeps his promise to banish dancing from his own school house.
