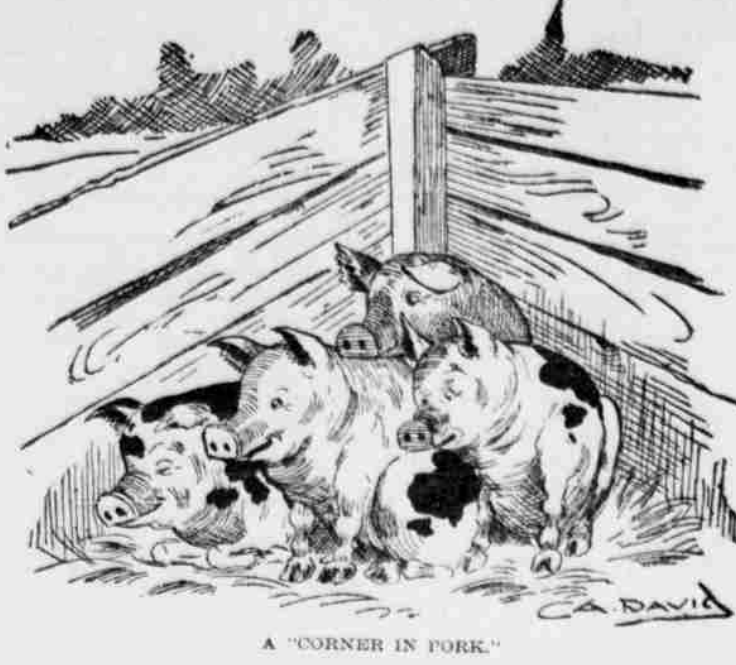

# WOOD IS SCARCE

UMATILLA COUNTY HAS LIMITLESS SUPPLY.

Narrow Strip of Timber Cut Off Along the Railroad Track—Worlds of Wood Yet Within Reach—Choppers More Prolific.

Is wood actually scarce in Umatilla county? Is it possible that the actual wood supply of Eastern Oregon is nearing exhaustion?

These questions are often asked by citizens of the valley districts who are not familiar with conditions in the mountains.

In a general sense, wood is not scarce. The great timber belts that reach from one end of Umatilla county to the other, along the summit and slopes of the Blue Mountains are not yet furnishing any supply to our fuel markets.

A narrow strip of timber land, perhaps of a general average of eight miles in width, lying along the line of the O. R. & N., is exhausted.

Sawmills in the days of railroad building, the makers and wood choppers have cut just about all of the available timber from this section of timber land.

Wagons Where Goats Can't Go.

At Allen's Spur, near Huron, wagon roads have been built around the steep sides of the ruggedest mountains, to reach the lingering clumps of timber that stood near the track.

At Porter's Spur and Huron, chutes have been built to the very summit of the most precipitous bluffs and the trees felled, cut into blocks and slid to the foot of the mountain to be split into cord wood, at the bottom of the canyon.

From these extraordinary efforts to get wood, it would seem that an actual scarcity exists, when the fact is it is cheaper to build these temporary chutes and get timber from high hills near the track than it is to haul it four or five miles. Plenty of excellent timber is to be found at a distance of four or five miles back in the mountains, but it will require a great amount of expensive road building to reach it in many places.

Twenty Years of Wood Hauling.

At Meacham and Kamela, where the wood business has been vigorously carried on for 20 years, the conditions are different from those at supply points of recent location. The mountains are not so rugged and good roads reach out for many miles each way. At these points the best timber land has been owned for years and a constant stream of cord wood and ties has poured to the markets of Eastern Oregon.

The reason so much inferior wood is found upon the market at present is because the choppers are now compelled to cut the poor grade of timber left standing near the railroad. The best timber has been marketed from these tracts for years, yet each succeeding season, choppers are sent over "the saw" to try to get a few carloads of something in the shape of wood.

As roads are made to better timber belts and more good wood is brought within reach of the railroads, choppers will be more plentiful. They show the mountain camps that have been cut over so many times.

## Poultry Show at Milwaukee.

Milwaukee, Wis., Dec. 15.—The Poultry Fanciers' Association of Milwaukee which was organized last March, opened its first annual exhibition today under auspicious circumstances. All parts of Wisconsin and several neighboring states are represented among the exhibits, which embrace a choice assortment of fancy chickens, pheasants, turkeys, ducks, geese and guinea fowl, together with a large display of Belgian hares. The award of premiums was commenced today under the direction of J. Y. Hicknell of Buffalo.

## Palmer vs. Curley.

London, Dec. 16.—One of the most important matches between English featherweights that has been arranged in years is to be decided tonight at Newmarket. The principals will be Will Curley, acknowledged to be one of the best fighters at his weight in England, and Pedlar Palmer, the former English champion bantam-weight boxer, who has shown much of his former cleverness since he has been boxing at the featherweight limit. The two fighters are to go 15 rounds for a purse of \$2,000. The contest has aroused considerable interest among the sporting fraternity in England, as both boys have a large following. In the event of the success of Palmer will be matched to fight Harry Harris of Chicago.
