UMATILLA WILL ASK FOR HIS APPOINTMENT.

Governor Chamberlain With No Doubt Give Him Superintendency of Penitentiary.

It is confidently expected that Governor Chamberlain will accept the splendid support given him in Umatilla county at the recent election, and in appreciation of the swinging majority he received over his opponent, appoint John Hailey, Jr., of Pendleton, superintendent of the Oregon penitentiary.

This appointment is asked for by friends of Mr. Hailey in the ranks of both political parties. They are not confined to Umatilla county alone, but the whole of Eastern Oregon seems to have thrown the mantle of choice on the Pendleton boy. "This fact," as a solid democrat puts it, "is not only a flattering testimonial of the popularity and esteem in which Mr. Hailey is held throughout the inland Empire, but is virtually the scroll of qualification for the place to which his friends ask the next governor to give him."

In this connection it is universally known that the qualifications possessed by Mr. Hailey have been acquired through years of hard practical experience. Before coming to this county Mr. Hailey was for three years superintendent of the Idaho penitentiary at Boise City, and managed that institution most successfully. Since coming to this county his work as deputy sheriff in handling criminals is recognized as being of the best character.

**BETTER FIRE DEPARTMENT.**  
Extra Men Added to the Walla Walla Crew.  
Walla Walla, Dec. 20.—Walla Walla's paid fire department has been increased from five men to 11, six extra men having been appointed by Chief Weber in accordance with a resolution passed by the city council. Each of the new men will be paid \$10 a month, and two of them will sleep at headquarters regularly. The men are David Stokes, Ralph White, Nat East, William O'Rourke, J. J. Schiffler, and William Retzer. The department has been found too small to handle fires in recent years, and the additional men have been added under a plan of small expense.

The recent muddy roads have given way under the frosty nights to hard, frozen roads, equal to any seen here in many years. ### GENERAL NEWS

The number of desertions from the United States army has become alarming. Many attribute it to the abolishment of the canteen and lack of amusement in the army.

The allies will today notify the Venezuelan authorities at La Guayra, of a blockade to become effective at 3 p. m. of the ports of La Guayra, Puerto Cabello, Cora, Maricao, Capurano and Barcelona.

United States Commissioner Benedict has ordered the deportation of 15 Chinamen who had not been registered under the exclusion act and could not show that they arrived in the United States before the passage of the act.

A jury at Elizabethtown, N. Y., has rendered a verdict of \$6000 damages against David Fleming, who, while playing on the Lake Placid links, last summer, threw his golf stick at his "caddy," causing the loss of the sight of one eye. The "caddy" brought suit for \$10,000.

The Japanese government has introduced a bill establishing a China and Japan bank for the purpose of financing Japanese enterprises in China. The capital of the bank is to be \$9,960,000. The government will furnish \$2,978,000 of this amount. The charter is for 50 years. Branches abroad will accept deposits at compound interest and issue premium-bearing bonds.

### PACIFIC NORTHWEST NEWS.

Toby Irwin, of San Francisco, won a 15-round fight from Jack Clifford of Butte, at Oakland, Friday.

A closed town fight is on at Pasco. It is the first anti-gambling demonstration in the history of the town.

Thomas Evans, a pioneer of Walla Walla county, died Friday at the home of A. L. Bates, on Blue Creek.

At the log-rolling of the Woodmen of the World, held at Dallas, on Friday night, 100 members were initiated.

Grant county, Oregon, citizens are to hold an anti-forest reserve meeting in the near future, to protest against the present boundaries.

Franklin S. Whitney, state organizer for the American Federation of Labor, and treasurer of the state federation, died at St. Joseph's hospital in Tacoma, Friday, of typhoid pneumonia, aged 25 years.

Thomas Huntington, a Portland contractor, has sued the Occidental Hotel company for \$5000, for injuries sustained by falling through a sidewalk, which had been torn up in making improvement, and left unguarded.

### NEW SANITARIUM COMPLETE.

Walter M. Pierce Making Substantial Improvements at Hot Lake.

Union, Dec. 20.—The new \$20,000 hotel, belonging to Senator W. M. Pierce, of Umatilla county, and Dr. G. W. Tapp, at Hot Lake, four miles northwest of Union, has been practically completed, the furniture—to cost about \$7000—has been ordered, and the new quarters will soon be ready for the reception of guests.

Arrangements are already well under way for another large building at this now famous resort. The building will be of brick and cost about \$12,000. It will be especially designed for a bath house.
