

leges for the Benefit of Agriculture

Section. 2 .- That the secretary of the interior is hereby authorized and directed to make examinations and surveys for, and to locate and con struct, as herein provided, irrigation works for the storage, diversion, and development of waters, including artesian wells, and to report to con-gress at the beginning of each regular session as to the results of such examinations and surveys, giving es-timates of cost of all contemplated works, the quantity and location of the lands which can be irrigated therefrom, and all facts relative to the practicability of each irrigation project; also the cost of the works in process of construction as well as of those which have been completed.

Section 3.-That the secretary of the interior shall, before giving the public notice provided for in section four of this act, withdraw from public entry the lands required for an irrigation works contemplated under the provisions of this act, and shall restore to public entry any of the lands so withdrawn when, in his judg-
