Since sheep shearing first became an industry of the Pacific Coast, the sheep-shearer has been the leading artist connected with the the the leading from Montens, the shearers artist connected with that business.

In fact, he is the only skilled trades-man attached to it, since it is an exiom of the country that "anybody (an raise sheep or herd sheep, but it takes an expert to shear them."

Sheep shearing, as a trade, sprang into existence with the accumulation of sheep into large bands on the Paclfic Coast. They join together under supervision of a "boss," who engages all the business possible in advance. The number of men in the crowd varies from 16 to 20, with the requirements of the locality. The usual man-ments of the locality. The usual manner of shearing in Oregon is for the shearers to go to each sheep owner's shearing pens. In Montana, and at places in Idaho, there are great public pens built to accommodate from 26 to 40 men, to which the flocks are driven from the adjacent ranges. 
