Umatilla County Pioneer.

Miller, of Pilot Rock, Re-Scapes of Early History.

Miller, a pioneer citizen of Pilot Rock, was in the city today with stock in fine condition in the city.

Seven years ago, Mr. Miller on a farm two miles east of Pilot Rock and has been a resident of Pilot Rock since then.

Miller is one of the very first to settle in Umatilla County. He located his claim on that portion of the river lying west of Main street, and built his house on the corner of the Alta street and Main street in 1862. A. M. Miller, the first sheriff of Umatilla County, was appointed by Governor Gibbs and was succeeded by the late Sheriff Miller.
