### Matron for Penitentiary.

At the request of a large delegation of women from Portland, Salem and other points, Representative Kay has introduced a bill to appropriate money and provide for a matron at the state penitentiary.

The bill provides that the governor shall appoint a matron at the penitentiary, whose duties shall be to look after and attend its female prisoners in the penitentiary. Her salary is fixed at \$40 a month, and the bill appropriates \$960 for the salary of the matron for the ensuing biennial term.

### To License Grazing Sheep.

Emmitt has introduced a bill to provide for a license tax for sheep grazing in counties other than that in which the same are assessed for the purpose of taxation. The license to be charged is 15 cents for each sheep. This is to go away with the moving of sheep to escape taxation.

### New Rights for Married Women.

Probably the majority of the people in Oregon are aware that a married woman is not qualified to act as executor or administrator of an estate. Hahn, of Clatsop, has introduced a bill to amend that section of the code 1135, so as to give married women this right.

### Herefords and Durhams.

E. F. Harney, from Upper McKay Creek, was in town yesterday trading. Mr. Harney is a stockman. He reports the tendency of the cattle raisers in his part of the county is to run to Hereford and Durham cattle exclusively, and there is scarcely a bovine to be seen anywhere that is not a grade of one or the other or both of those families.
