Outlook for Bowling Tourney.
 Indianapolis, Jan. 31.—Secretary Robert H. Bryson, with whom entries closed today for the approaching championship tournament of the National Bowling Association, reports the list of prospective competitors as the largest in the history of the association tournaments. The list shows that representative teams will compete from New York, Chicago, Buffalo, Cincinnati, Minneapolis, Milwaukee, Indianapolis, Toledo and numerous other leading cities of the country. In the five-men teams and individuals there will be representatives from nearly all the Western and Southern states. Workmen will commence next week putting Tomlinson hall in shape for the tournament. The construction of 10 alleys was originally contemplated, but it now appears probable that an even dozen will be required to accommodate the large number of contestants.
