TEMPTED THEFT

BOYD HAND STORE
WAS BROKEN INTO.

Evening Someone Entered Thompson's Shop on Court Street—He Returned at 7 O'Clock, Preventing Anything Being Stolen.

Thompson was made last Monday by burglarize A. D. Thompson hand store and pawn shop at 211 Court street.

Thompson locked the store about 7 o'clock and went down street some distance. He thinks he was watched at the time he locked up, and that the perpetrators of the breaking in were in the building for some time. However, he returned about 7 o'clock, unlocked the store and turned on the lights. He then discovered that the store was in considerable confusion, and began to investigate. So far as he was able to determine at the time and since, not a thing of value was taken from the store.

Among a number of good guns and some other articles had been taken from the floor as though in readiness to pick them up easily and depart with them. His writing desk and cupboard had been mugged over, and the robber was in search of valuables in a small corner.

It was ascertained that the perpetrators had secured ingress through a window to the building, by first breaking the high fence surrounding the store next to the window. Two panes of glass had been broken from the lower part of the sash, and through the hole thus made the burglars had gotten into the room. It is supposed that the robber was in an undersized

Ex-Senator Proebstel Goes to the Capital to Renew Old Acquaintances and Listen to Legislators.

G. W. Proebstel, of Weston, ex-state senator for Umatilla county, is in the city today, en route to Portland and Salem to spend a few days visiting and sight-seeing during the legislative session. Mr. Proebstel thinks the senatorial situation is as badly mixed now as at the session two years ago.

He is the father of the anti-slot machine bill now in force in Oregon, and enjoys the distinction of being the cause of the moral crusade which has resulted in removing these machines from the list of temptations before the citizens of his state.
