MAY CHANGE LINE

O. R. & N. COULD SHORTEN DISTANCE OVER MOUNTAINS.

Big Tunneling Through Point of Mountain Could Do Away With Helpers—A Line Up Butcher Creek From Huron Would Open Up Fine Timber Belt.

An engineering feat which will probably be accomplished in Umatilla county before many years has been under consideration by the engineering department of the O. R. & N., since its line was first located over the Blue mountains.

The expense of maintaining helper engines on the summit of the mountains is so great that the company has sought long to remove the necessity of this service.

Shorter trains and lighter tonnage cannot be adopted as a remedy, because one engine on the level can handle the tonnage of three engines on the mountain and the enormous cost of the large engines and the system of economizing expenses makes it necessary to haul large trains with one crew in order to reap the benefit of the big engines.

Every conceivable pass over the mountain has been prospected with a view of securing a lighter grade, which would do away with helpers. This cannot be found, except at one point, and that point would necessitate a tunnel 3000 feet long, but would shorten the distance from Pendleton to La Grande by 14 miles and would reduce the grade to such an extent that one helper at Kamela would do the work of three, as at present.

By the present line the distance from Huron to Hilgard by way of Kamela and Meacham is 25 miles and the railway train in traversing this distance, travels toward every point of the compass. Several actual loops are made between Huron and Meacham, as the road follows the tortuous canyon of Meacham creek. It has the reputation of being the crookedest piece of roadbed in the Northwest. In coming down the canyon, the sun shines in at both sides and both ends of the coach, at different places, and is the only point on the line where old employees lose their bearing. The canyon is very deep and crooked and the grade averages something like 200 feet per mile. Sharp curves and reverse curves cause the long trains to pull hard and it is the scene of more grief for trainmen than any other point on the line, as the heavy engines slip and stall very often, breaking out draw-bars and causing serious delays.

The engineering feat which promised to remove the necessity of climbing this steep canyon is to build a line of Butcher creek, from Huron, on an easy, water grade, to the summit of the mountain, tunnel 3000 feet through a spur of the Blue mountain peak and pass down the gradual slope of the eastern side, through the canyon of Five Points creek, to Hilgard.

From Huron to Hilgard by the present line is 25 miles, while by this proposed route it is but 11 miles, over an easy grade. By the present route it requires three monster locomotives to haul 1200 tons; by the proposed route two engines could pull 1400 tons, while the passenger trains would not be helped at all.

This change would do away with the \$600 per month helper expense at Kamela; it would shorten the mileage 14 miles, and would open up an easy mountain pass over which the large trains could be handled with comparative ease.

This route would also tap a large body of the best timber in the Blue mountains, on the headwaters of the various creeks that feed the Umatilla river and Meacham creek and would bring into life two or three wood and lumber camps along the line that would rival Meacham in her palmiest days.

New Central League.

Anderson, Ind., Feb. 4.—A meeting of the stockholders of the Central Baseball League teams, which was organized at Indianapolis last month, is in session here today to elect officers and complete the work of organization. The names of several men are mentioned in connection with the presidency and it is difficult to forecast the result of the election. The schedule committee has about completed its work. It is likely that the season will open April 23 and that the schedule will embrace 140 games.

Kentucky Fair Circuit.

Louisville, Ky., Feb. 4.—A meeting of the secretaries of the county fairs throughout Kentucky was held here to discuss the formation of a state fair circuit. The object of the proposed circuit is to control the county fairs, so that the dates will not conflict, and so that the interests of exhibitors will be protected from loss of time and other evils consequent on the present disorganized custom of holding the county exhibitions. Many counties have responded to the call and from present indications the movement will be successful.
